Tytenicz Named to Aeronautics Commission Staff

OKLAHOMA CITY – The Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission recently approved the appointment of Treasure Tytenicz as the government affairs liaison and special assistant for the Commission.

“We are excited to have Treasure as an integral part of our staff,” Commission Director Victor Bird said. “I am confident in her abilities to work with elected officials from both parties to promote the efficiency of our state’s air transportation system and the growth of our aerospace industry, the state’s top employer.”

Tytenicz, who is originally from Jones, Okla., where she grew up on the family farm that her great-grandparents bought, most recently served as an Institutional Review Board administrator for the Oncology Board at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center in Oklahoma City. Prior to her stint at the OU Health Sciences Center, she spent eight years as a legislative assistant for the Oklahoma House of Representatives, including two years in the Speaker’s office. Among her major duties were managing all public relations with constituents, tracking legislation throughout the session and conducting constituent casework.

Before joining the House staff, she served three years at Sapulpa Public Schools where she taught history at both the high school and middle school. She was also employed as an editorial assistant with Cheri Fuller Communications in Edmond.

Tytenicz has a master’s degree in human relations from OU and a bachelor’s degree in government from Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Okla. She also earned her teaching certificate from the University of Central Oklahoma in Edmond.

The Commission’s mission is to encourage, foster and assist in the development of aeronautics in Oklahoma and to encourage the establishment and maintenance of airports. This includes the preservation and improvement of the state’s 114 public airports in communities throughout the state, which make up the State Airport System.
