

BOARD MEETING - AUGUST 25, 1999**Reciprocities and Score Transfers**

The following reciprocities and score transfers were accepted into Oklahoma after successfully completing the Jurisprudence Exam: Amy Haney Gebhart (TX), #12620; Brenton Dave Horner (TX), #12621; Ryan Brett Hurst (TX), #12622; Selamawit Negusse (TX), #12623.

Disciplinary Action*R.Ph. #12436 - Case 545*

Respondent received two (2) warning notices within the past twelve months as a result of misfilling prescriptions. A letter of reprimand was placed in his file for a period of one year.

R.Ph. #12337 - Case 547

Respondent received two (2) warning notices within the past twelve months. One warning was the result of a misfill and the other was issued for filling a CDS for the wife of the prescribing physician. A letter of reprimand was placed in her file for a period of six (6) months.

R.Ph. #12441 - Case 546

Respondent received two (2) warning notices within the past twelve months. One warning was the result of a misfill and the other was issued for filling a CDS for the wife of the prescribing physician. A letter of reprimand was placed in her file for a period of six (6) months.

R.Ph. #10584 - Case 542

Respondent was found guilty of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. The violations related to shortages and record keeping of CDS's.

Respondent was fined \$500 on two counts for a total fine of \$1,000.00. He must also conduct an audit of CDS each month for the next six (6) months.

Eckerd's - Case 520

An Eckerd Vice-President appeared and gave the Board a review of the Quality Improvement Program that had been instituted in Oklahoma for Eckerd pharmacies. He indicated that the company was pleased with the program's outcomes. The number of incidents to the volume of prescriptions filled was very minute and they are continuing to work toward zero errors.

R.Ph. #11290 - Case 487

Respondent appeared before the Board at the request of Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP) to discuss his compliance with his OPHP contract. He agreed to meet the compliance requirements.

R.Ph. #11157 - Case 550

Respondent was found to be out of compliance with his OPHP contract. An Agreed Order was issued that suspended his license for ten (10) years. All of the suspension was placed on probation. He also agreed to attend a one day law seminar and get an additional fifteen (15) hours of continuing education.

Disciplinary Action

R.Ph. #11408 - Case 532

The respondent was found guilty of four (4) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. The four counts included the theft of CDS's for personal use, practice pharmacy while impaired and non-compliance with his OPHP contract.

The current probation of his license was revoked. His license is suspended for the remainder of his original term until October 2007. He may request that the suspension be placed on probation on October 21, 2004. He was fined a total of \$500.00 and shall continue to participate in Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists (OPHP).

R.Ph. #11698 - Case 553

The respondent was found guilty of two (2) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act. Count I related to willfully making a false representation on his application for pharmacist licensure. Count II related to non-compliance with his OPHP contract.

The current probation of his license was revoked. His license is suspended for the remainder of his original term until October 2007. He may request that the suspension be placed on probation on October 21, 2004. He was fined a total of \$1,000.00 and shall continue to participate in Oklahoma Pharmacists Helping Pharmacists.

R.Ph. #8418 - Case 554

The respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. He was found guilty of fourteen (14) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act.

His license was suspended for five (5) years. He may request that the suspension be placed on probation in February 2000. He was fined a total of \$2,800.00 and shall attend a one day law seminar for the next three (3) years in addition to the 15 hours of required CE.

R.Ph. #9505 - Case 557

The respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Board. He was found guilty of five (5) counts of violation of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act.

He license was suspended for four (4) years with the suspension placed on probation. He must also comply with the terms of his Agreed Order with the Texas Board of Pharmacy and was fined a total of \$250.00.
