TITLE 158. CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRIES BOARD
CHAPTER 1. PROCEDURES OF THE OKLAHOMA
CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRIES BOARD

Before the Construction Industries Board
February 8, 2012

1. **DESCRIPTION** The purpose of the proposed rules is to change the address of the agency in February, 2012, O.S. § Section 1000.2 of Title 59.
2. **CLASSES OF PERSONS AFFECTED:** Those persons or entities affected by this rule change will be persons contacting the agency.
3. **CLASSES OF PERSONS BENEFITTED:** Those persons or entities affected by this rule change will be persons contacting the agency.
4. **ECONOMIC IMPACT:** The Board is not supported by Oklahoma appropriations and is self-funded. These proposed rule changes do not change fees or costs.
5. **COSTS AND BENEFITS TO THE AGENCY:** The Board is not supported by Oklahoma appropriations and is self-funded. The increase in rental costs to the agency is anticipated to be minimal.
6. **ECONOMIC IMPACT ON POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS:** No economic impact on any political subdivision is anticipated by the proposed rules.
7. **ECONOMIC IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESS:** There is no anticipated economic effect on small businesses and no anticipated changes of their business practices mandated by these proposed rule changes.
8. **MEASURES TAKEN TO MINIMIZE COMPLIANCE COSTS:** These proposed rule changes are the least costly or least intrusive method and no less costly or less intrusive methods exist for achieving the purpose of the proposed rules changes.
9. **EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED RULE ON PUBLIC HEALTH:** There is no anticipated change on public health and safety of the proposed rules.
10. **DETRIMENTS TO PUBLIC HEALTH IF THE RULE IS NOT ADOPTED:** If these proposed rules are not adopted, the Construction Industries Board would have to seek a new lease elsewhere. The current lease may not be extended by the landlord.
