- Promotes positive, pro-social attitudes and behavior, while fostering healthy relationships, resistance to substance abuse and conflict, and resistance to negative peer pressure and influences.
- Mitigates risk factors and promotes resiliency through the development of these skills and traits: Goal Setting, Decision Making, Effective Communication, Anger Management, Media Literacy, Conflict Resolution and Pro-Social Bonding.
