

The Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) Course is a 40-hour training (CLEET with 2-hours mental health credit) that teaches participants to identify, assess and manager threats they may come across. This course is geared to law enforcement who may be tasked with conducting threat investigations and responsible for the management of those who are identified with a level of concern for committing an act of targeted violence.

This course is open to all with preference given to federal, tribal, state, and local law enforcement. There is no cost for this training.

OUTLINE

Day 1 Initial Training

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security, National Threat Evaluation and Reporting Program (NTER).



The Basic Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (B-TERC) is a oneday training that teaches participants how to identify and report threats or observable behaviors that may concern others, to assist in preventing acts of targeted violence, such as, but not limited to, terrorism, school shootings, or mass attacks in public spaces. Participants are equipped with the tools to identify and report threats or observable behaviors that may concern others, as well as recognize intervention strategies to move individuals off the pathway to violence.

Day 2 – 5 Case Based Practical Exercise

Initial Intake and Assessment | Investigation | Assessment | Management | Team Development

Days 2-5 will be presentations followed by instructor lead breakout sessions.
