- Learning and understanding Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Positive Childhood Experiences (PCEs) and their impact on the brain, personal health and the health and safety of our communities.
- Recognize and be aware of how your trauma experiences and ACE score impact you and the job you perform.
- Utilizing the knowledge of trauma to positively impact our communities and decrease crime.
- Utilizing the knowledge of trauma to positively impact law enforcement job satisfaction and decrease burnout.
- Understanding historical and generational trauma and its impact on the officer and people you come in contact with.
