FY 2014 Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Grant

The purpose of the **R**esidential **S**ubstance **A**buse **T**reatment (RSAT) Grant is to assist states and units of local government in developing and implementing residential substance abuse treatment programs within state and local correctional and detention facilities in which prisoners are incarcerated for a period of time sufficient to permit substance abuse treatment.

In order to receive programmatic funding, state correctional and detention treatment programs must ensure that programs:

- I. Last between six and twelve months;
- 2. Be provided in residential treatment facilities where participating prisoners are set apart from the general correctional population;
- 3. Focus on substance abuse problems of the inmate;
- 4. Develop the inmate's cognitive, behavioral, social, vocational, and other skills; and,
- 5. Continue to conduct urinalysis and/or other proven reliable forms of drug and alcohol testing for those enrolled in the residential substance abuse treatment programs and post programs while they remain in the custody of the state.

The Oklahoma Department of Corrections (DOC) was awarded \$146,606.40 to implement the RSAT Grant Program in seven (7) facilities across the state. It is anticipated that the DOC will serve approximately 602 offenders in FY2014.
