

## Guide to Immunization Requirements in Oklahoma 2009-2010

- This table lists the vaccines that are required for children to attend childcare and school. Not all recommended vaccines are required.
- Children in childcare must be up-to-date for their age for the vaccines listed.
- All measles, mumps and rubella (MMR), varicella, and hepatitis A vaccine doses must be administered on or after the child's first birthday or within 4 days before the birthday to be counted as valid doses.
- **If the 4<sup>th</sup> dose of DTP/DTaP is administered on or after the child's 4<sup>th</sup> birthday then the 5<sup>th</sup> dose of DTP/DTaP is not required.**
- **Beginning Jan. 1, 2003 if a 5<sup>th</sup> dose of DTaP is required it must be given on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday or within 4 days before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.**
- **If the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of Polio is administered on or after the child's 4<sup>th</sup> birthday then the 4<sup>th</sup> dose of Polio is not required.**
- **Hepatitis B may be administered in a two (2) dose series to children 11 through 15 years of age.** All other ages must receive three (3) doses of Hepatitis B vaccine.
- **If a parent reports that their child had chickenpox disease the child is not required to receive varicella vaccine.**
- Hib and PCV vaccines are not required for students in pre-school, pre-kindergarten or kindergarten through grade twelve, but they are required for children in childcare.
- **It is not necessary to restart the series of any vaccine if the next dose due was not given on schedule because longer than recommended time intervals between doses do not effect final immunity.**
- Children may be allowed to attend school and childcare if they have received the first dose in the series of any multi-dose vaccine but must complete the series on schedule. These children are "in the process" of receiving immunizations.
- Doses administered 4 days or less, before the minimum intervals or ages, will be counted as valid doses; this applies to all children including those already enrolled.
- Children who do not complete the DTaP series by their 7<sup>th</sup> birthday must complete the series with Td or Tdap whichever is appropriate for a total of 4 doses; 3 doses in the primary series and a booster. The booster dose may be due 5 to 10 years following the primary series so some adolescents may graduate before the booster dose is due.
