Grantee Profile: Two additional sites reported are from Tulsa City County Health Department and Oklahoma City County Health Department. Each opened an additional site to target the African American population with support of additional Federal Title X funds.

Table 1: The reduction in numbers served was primarily related to the county health department system where there was a decrease of provider coverage and a public health priority for providing services for H1N1 prevention. In addition to the decrease in providers, the OSDH made some slight changes in our data collection system to assure more accurate reporting of services.

Added by the Regional Office: the changes to the data collection system included eliminating those women visiting a health clinic only for a confirmatory pregnancy test required by other programs.

Table 12: Added by Regional Office: The number of Syphilis tests increased from the previous year following a cycle of visits to county health department clinics where health department staff stressed the importance of testing for syphilis and HIV when another STD test was positive.

Table 13: Regarding the increase in physician and nurse practitioner FTE's: This year, the full effort of the Oklahoma Family Planning Program is being reported. In previous years, only the percentage of the FTE's that the Title X Grant supported was reported. For example, of the 4.46 Physician FTE's and 39.33 Practitioner FTE's in 2009, 4.23 and 17.67 were supported by Title X

Grant funds, respectively.

Added by Regional Office: The decrease in clinical encounters and the increase in non-clinical encounters (compared to the previous year) reflect the clarification of the "other clinical services provider" definition and shifting their encounters with clients to "non-clinical" encounters.
