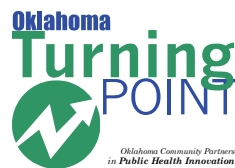

Advocacy & Influence

This session will review the fundamentals of effective advocacy and how community Turning Point Partnerships can influence health policy.

Rx Drugs/Meth: Immerging Issues & Innovative Answers

Substance abuse has been a problem that has affected our communities for years. With recent changes in they way meth is made and the increase in the abuse of prescription drugs we face new challenges. This session will take a look at the evolving issues related to meth and prescription drugs and what some communities are doing to address the problem.

Wellness Score

An evaluation of the Wellness Score has identified four board areas that contain multiple health influencing factors including Workforce Development and Retention, Connecting Communities with Primary and Preventative Medical Services, Physical Activity Through Community Design and Healthy Choices and Economically Sound Communities. Targeting intervention strategies through coordinated purposeful efforts would result in measurable improvements in individual, community, and geographic health measures.

Community Health Centers: Affordable Health Care for All

A brief summary of the history of the 330 program nationally and in Oklahoma. Highlights include the growth of the Community Health Centers in recent years and provides data regarding the demographics of the patients served.

Advancements and Opportunities in Tobacco Control Policy

This session will provide insights on new and proposed tobacco control policies with an emphasis on restoring the rights of Oklahoma communities to take action.

Connecting the Community

This session will highlight Oklahoma communities who have been successful at developing walkable, bikeable spaces to improve health and fitness.

Good Health: What Do Adolescents Have to Do with It???

The answer: A lot! Too often, however, communities ignore or abandon adolescents when it comes to quality health education and programs – especially when it comes to sexuality education and teen pregnancy prevention. This workshop will provide a snapshot of resources and evidence-based programs that are helping address the recent and dramatic *increase* in teen birth rates and numbers in Oklahoma and around the country. The most effective solutions to teen pregnancy prevention are found where the teens live – in the local communities!

“Issue Institute: What Communities Can Do to Prevent Teen Pregnancy” will be a special parallel track designed for participants working with the teen pregnancy/parenting issues. The session will also include a teen pregnancy prevention workshop during the regular conference.

Directions to the Nigh University Center

From I-35: Take the East 2nd Street/US 77 South exit #141. Turn onto East 2nd westbound. Follow East 2nd Street approximately 2.5 miles to Garland Godfrey Drive and turn right at stoplight. (See further instructions below.)

From I-235/Broadway/US77: Follow US77/ Broadway into Edmond northbound to East 2nd Street. Turn onto East 2nd Street eastbound approximately .5 miles to Garland Godfrey Drive and turn left at stoplight. (See further instructions below.)
