

Significant Shipping and Packaging Regulation Changes for 2007

1.) Risk Groups (DOT)	Category A & B
2.) Diagnostic or Clinical Substance (IATA, DOT)	Biological Substance, Category B (UN3373) (IATA, DOT)
3.) USPS ships Category A infectious substances	USPS NO LONGER accepts Category A infectious substances for shipping
4.) 500mL per primary (DOT)	1L per primary
5.) No emergency number for diagnostic, clinical substances, or biological substances, category B (DOT, IATA)	Name & emergency number on documentation/outer packaging of Category B packages (DOT & IATA)
6.) Risk Group 1 (DOT)	Exempt Human Specimens
7.) Include technical name on Category A <u>packages</u> (IATA, DOT)	Technical name need not be marked on the <u>outer packaging</u> . (IATA, DOT)
8.) Shipping <u>paper</u> includes technical name with proper shipping name. (IATA, DOT)	If technical name not known, use "Infectious substances, affecting humans (suspected Category A infectious substance). (IATA, DOT)
9.) Dangerous Goods form column in any sequence (IATA, DOT)	UN number 1 st column only (IATA, DOT)
