Monday is the 4th Annual March Against Meth Day in Oklahoma, as proclaimed by Governor Brad Henry.

Students across the state will participate in this special day to raise awareness about the dangers of methamphetamine use.

March Against Meth is a tribute to Trooper Rocky Eales #632 who was killed in the line of duty on Sep. 24, 1999 while trying to serve a search warrant at a residence in rural Sequoyah County. Trooper Eales was involved in drug interdiction with the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs during his career.

Law enforcement officers from across the state will be distributing special wrist bands along with a D.A.R.E. Parent Alert Letter regarding methamphetamine.

March Against Meth is in partnership with the **Crystal Darkness** Phase II Meth Education.
