888-246-2675	Public Response Service: Handles calls and emails from the general public, providing general information on smallpox vaccine and possible adverse reactions, as well as other public health issues. Designed to provide CDC-approved information during a biological, chemical or nuclear terrorism emergency. Has the capacity to respond to 1,200 contacts per day, and can modify hours if needed. Routes calls to CDC's Clinician Information Line according to protocol. Routes other emergency calls to CDC's EOC. 405/271-4060	Oklahoma State Department of Health Smallpox Adverse Events and Consultation -- Physicians and other health care providers should report adverse events from smallpox vaccine to this number.	24/7	
877-554-4625	<u>Clinician Information Line (CIL)</u> : Receives calls from physicians and other health care providers regarding smallpox, smallpox vaccine and adverse events resulting from smallpox vaccination. Triage clinician calls regarding potential adverse events and routes calls to CDC Clinical Consulting Team for consultation regarding vaccine adverse events and release of VIG/Cidofovir when indicated. Directs clinicians to VAERS to facilitate completion of VAERS reports. ***Calls from clinicians regarding military personnel will be routed to the DoD Vaccine Clinical Call Center 866-210-6469. All calls will be sent to appropriate areas within the military system through this line.	24/7

800-822-7967	<u>Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System</u> : Receives inquiries from States and public and private health care providers reporting adverse reactions from all US licensed vaccines. Routes smallpox vaccination calls whenever appropriate to Clinician Information Line and/or the CDC Clinical Consulting Team.	M – F, 8AM – 6PM, ET	
Through EOC 770-488-7100 - or- Clinician Info Line 877-554-4625	<u>Rash On-Call System</u> : Receives reports of suspicious rash/fever illnesses and provides clinical and technical assistance. Forwards calls to the Clinician Information Line and/or CDC's Clinical Consulting Team as needed. EOC typically receives calls and transfers calls to Rash On-Call System.	24/7	Maintains 24/7 internal on-call system.
	<u>CDC Clinical Consulting Team</u> : Provides clinical consultation to the Clinician Information Line and State Adverse Events Coordinators for reports of suspicious reactions to smallpox vaccine. Makes determination of need for VIG/Cidofovir and refers such calls to other CDC Clinicians for arrangements to ship VIG/Cidofovir to treating physicians.	24/7	Use CIL first. Maintains 24/7 internal on-call system.

Provides triaged assistance to DoD beneficiaries and providers treating them, who are concerned about immunization healthcare and vaccine-associated adverse-event diagnosis, treatment and reporting. Coordinates with DoD Vaccine Healthcare Centers (VHC).	24/7	
202-782-0411	DoD Vaccine Healthcare Centers (VHC): Provides consultation services by email (askvhc@amedd.army.mil). In case of medical emergency, refer patient to local or regional clinical services. Follow-up case management, educational resources and confidential consultation about medical exemptions or adverse-event care available through the DoD VHCs.	M-F, 8AM to 5PM, ET	
888-USA-RIID 888-872-7443	US Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases.: Provides information about vaccinia immune globulin (VIG) or cidofovir to physicians caring for military personnel or their contacts. Handles inquiries from physicians regarding military personnel (or contacts) who received or are about to receive smallpox vaccine, to discuss potential role for VIG or cidofovir.	24/7	
<u>Payment information</u>	Information for civilian healthcare providers for patients enrolled in a Military Medical Treatment Facility: If a Reservist or Active Duty Military Member presents for a condition that may be an adverse event caused by a military vaccination, the provider may contact the military hospital or clinic where the member is enrolled for assistance with filing a claim for payment. 888-647-6676	Information for civilian health care providers for patients enrolled in TRICARE., Prime Remote, Reservists, and National Guard Members. If a patient is enrolled in TRICARE Prime Remote, is Reservist or National Guard member, provider may contact the Military Medical Support Office (MMS) for assistance with filing a claim for payment.	24/7
