Marginal Well Commission Fee Increases

In 1992, the Oklahoma Legislature passed Senate Bill 684, now Title 52 O.S. Section 700 which allowed for a voluntary fee to be collected by the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) from the revenue stream of oil and gas production with the proceeds underwriting the efforts of the Commission on Marginally Producing Oil and Gas Wells (MWC). The fee is based on volume not price.

The percentage of the agency's gross operating revenues attributable to the voluntary fee declined in production from 100% at its inception to approximately 60% last year. Senate Bill 136 was passed by the Senate and signed into law by the Governor, effective January 1, 2008, to increase the Marginal Well Commission's fees to \$.00015 per mcf of gas and \$.0035 per bbl of oil. The change in the fee will change the percentage to approximately 72%, with the balance of the agency's operating revenues coming from other MWC programs.

The OTC has updated the Marginal Producing Oil and Gas Remittance Form (GPF316) and it is available for download from their website at www.tax.ok.gov/gpforms.html or by visiting

MWC Website. Mail the remittance with payment to Oklahoma Tax Commission, Compliance Division, Marginal Well Fee (GPF), P. O. Box 269056, Oklahoma City, OK 73126-9056. You can submit your assessment electronically online by visiting www.oktax.onenet.net/oerb/oerb_logon.htm, and creating an account using your OTC company number and FEIN number.

The fee and report should be received by the OTC on or before the twenty-fifth day of the second calendar month following the month of production. However, the assessment shall not be due until the accrued liability reaches \$25.00, except any amount accrued for any calendar year shall be paid by February 25th of the following year.

oil and gas industry and public by defining, identifying, and evaluating the economic and operational factors of marginally producing oil and gas wells, and to assure the appropriate efforts are made to extend the life of these wells so energy can be economically provided to all citizens of the State of Oklahoma.

How does the MWC accomplish its mission? The Commission uses education as the key ingredient to keeping marginal wells producing and production flowing in the State of Oklahoma. The Commission plans and sponsors extensive workshop programs covering all facets of the industry, and holds two operator roundtable discussions per year. 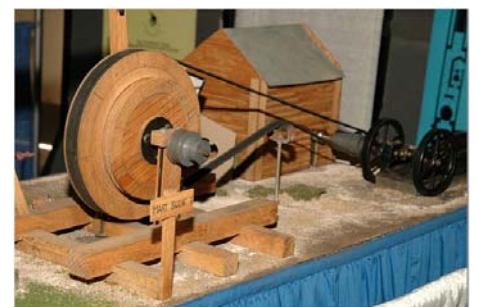

Workshops Update

The Marginal Well Commission (MWC) hosted a series of workshops on the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) website and the wealth of oil and gas information that can be obtained there. We did experience technical difficulties while conducting this workshop which was held in computer labs, but Donna Darnell addressed those issues with the OCC IT department once the workshops were completed. 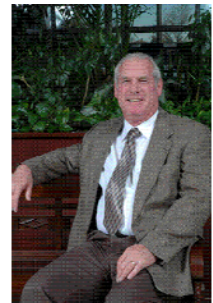
The Marginal Well Commission (MWC) also hosted a series of workshops entitled Back to Basics - Open Hole Log Interpretation that were instructed by Gary Batcheller of GWB Consultants. The workshops were held in Norman, OK and Tulsa, OK, each over a two-day period in September and November of 2007. This workshop presented basic concepts using an "Interpretation at a Glance" technique developed by the instructor and it focused on the "wiggles" and how to interpret them. The intent was to introduce the basics of formation evaluation using open hole logs including a variety of tools used to identify shale, permeability, lithology and hydrocarbon type. Interactive examples were used within group exercises and log examples were provided to enhance the workshop. Also, the intent was to show students how to distinguish water from hydrocarbon, permeable zones, determine porosity and calculate the percent of water in porosity. Operator Roundtable Update

The Oklahoma Marginal Well Commission hosted a Roundtable for the Operator's in and around District IV of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission. The Roundtable was held in McAlester, OK at the Southeast Expo Center on September 13, 2007. The purpose of the Roundtable was to address issues and administer presentations on technologies and techniques that would improve or continue the production of oil and gas. The first presentation was given by Jim Medico of Sunoco Logistics Partners, L.P. regarding The Importance of Marginal Wells. Jim does a terrific job of explaining the overall global energy picture and per capita energy use to the audience and

how marginal wells contribute to not only Oklahoma, but to our nation as a whole. Terry Cronkite of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) followed with a brief presentation on Oilfield Theft and what signs to look for to know if you have a problem at your locations. He again encouraged the attendees to follow procedure and call their local county sheriff's office, and then report the incident(s) to the OSBI Oilfield Theft Unit at (405) 879-2617. Les Robertson of Bachman Services, Inc. gave a very informative presentation on Chemical Treatments with Bachman's triazine liquid hydrogen sulfide scavenger, gas well de-watering foaming agents and down hole corro-

sion control. The most important feature of this program is the effectiveness and its extreme economical value for marginal wells. The Benefits of Fiberod fiberglass sucker rods was presented by Jackie Thomas of Fiberod. He outlined the decreased energy consumption, and cost and durability comparativeness to steel rods. He also explained the tremendous guarantee that Fiberod stands behind, if you use their product. The American Burying Beetle has been causing problems for production and drilling operations in southeastern and northeastern Oklahoma and specifically the Woodford Trend. Michael Swift of Continental Resources, Inc. was gracious enough

to put a presentation together and be on hand at the last minute to explain to the attendees about the American Burying Beetle, why the U.S. Fish and Wildlife are trying to preserve the beetle's habitat and what can be done to continue operations in areas where the beetle is affected. SPCC Overview, Update and Annual Training Requirement was instructed by Ken Murphy of Enviro Clean Products and Services. We just completed a series of workshops on SPCC Annual Review and Training after a series of phone calls made to the Marginal Well Commission. The calls were from operators who had recently been inspected by the Environmental Protection

Agency and they were fined for noncompliance with the annual training requirement in 40 CFR 112(f), which requires all oil-handling employees to have an annual review and training. Please visit the MWC website for further details on SPCC Plans and to locate additional information.
