At approximately 8:15 p.m., on March 23, 2007, three (3) juveniles escaped from the L.E. Rader Center in Sand Springs. The three overpowered 1 Youth Guidance Specialist (YGS) in the unit, took his keys, opened the exit door and escaped from the facility. The YGS staff that was attacked received minor injuries but did not seek medical attention.

The Sand Springs Police Department was notified immediately and began searching for the three escapees. Those escapees are:

*Sean Batt, 18.8 years of age*

**Physical Description: Native American Male, 5'6", 130 lbs., Blonde hair, Green eyes**

**Adjudicated Offenses: Auto Burglary, Possession of a Stolen Vehicle (2 counts), Grand Larceny, Joyriding**

**Court Jurisdiction: Tulsa County**

*Edward Moore, 17.11 years of age*

**Physical Description: White Male, 6'1", 200 lbs., Brown hair, Brown eyes**

**Adjudicated Offenses: Assault and Battery (2 counts), Domestic Abuse, Burglary II (2 counts)**

**Court Jurisdiction: Oklahoma County**

*Joshua Callshim, 17.4 years of age*

**Physical Description: Native American Male, 5'7", 180 lbs., Black hair, Brown eyes**

**Adjudicated Offenses: Assault with a Dangerous Weapon, Burglary I, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle, Domestic Abuse, Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance, Possession of a Motor Vehicle**

**Court Jurisdiction: Tulsa County**

The three residents were adjudicated delinquent, not Youthful Offenders, and Batt was within four months of aging out and being automatically released from the facility. Juvenile delinquents, unless extended to age 19 by the court of jurisdiction, are released from the Office of Juvenile Affairs (OJA) custody at age 18 and are returned to the community.

The Office of Juvenile Affairs' Rader staff are working closely with law enforcement in the search for these three escapees.

If you have information or knowledge of these juveniles location, contact law enforcement immediately.

Executive Director Robert E. "Gene" Christian, on scene within 2 ½ hours of the escape, stated, "Our first priority is to locate these juveniles and once located, recommend to the Tulsa County District Attorney's office full prosecution of the three escapees on all applicable charges."
