## **Time Running Out For Tax Rebate Address Change**

**OKLAHOMA CITY** – Time is running out. Oklahomans who have moved without leaving a forwarding order with the postal service, but who want to receive their state taxpayer relief checks, only have until Friday to let the state know their new addresses.

“Response has been very good,” State Treasurer Scott Meacham said. “So far almost 4,000 people have completed address changes on our web site, but we want to make sure we have the right address for everyone.”

A special web site, [www.ok.gov/taxrelief](http://www.ok.gov/taxrelief), is where taxpayers who have moved can go to let the state know of their new addresses. However, Meacham said a special phone line has also been established to provide further help for taxpayers.

“Those who need help finding a place to access the Internet, have questions about the rebate or who can not use the Internet can call 405-522-3333,” Meacham said. “A recorded message walks the callers through several options, including live operators who will take their address change information.”

The operators are available Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. During off hours, callers can leave a message for an operator to return their call during business hours.

Taxpayer relief checks will be mailed starting at the end of next month to distribute some \$92 million in surplus state revenue. Single taxpayers will receive approximately \$45, while married filers will receive approximately \$90.
