Compared to last week: Feeder steers mostly 2.00-3.00 lower, heifers not well tested. Demand moderate. Feeder cattle market continues volatile as cattle feeders remain cautious in light of much red ink in the business. Parts of the state have received light rain and some snow this week improving wheat graze out prospects. The majority of cattle on wheat for harvest are now sold or at least penned up. Auction receipts from about mid week on are significantly less than before. Supply included 97 percent over 600 lbs and 17 percent heifers.

Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
