ALFALFA HAY: Alfalfa hay movement is slow and prices are steady. A dry line moved across the state the first of the week bringing a narrow band of thunderstorms. Some areas of the central part of the state received up to two inches of rain. The entire state is still in need of moisture. Heavy snow and blizzard conditions are in the forecast the end of the week for the northwest half of the state. These winter conditions will increase demand, but hamper movement of hay. Wheat producers will be watching the low temperatures for the possible effect on the wheat plants that are in the boot stage in the southwest.

GRASS HAY: Grass hay prices are steady to weak and movement is slow. Producers still have grass hay available in large quantities in the eastern half of the state. Compared to last week: Feeder steers mostly 1.00-2.00 higher, heifers not enough last week for a market comparison, trending higher. Demand moderate. Feeder cattle market continues volatile as cattle feeders remain cautious in light of much red ink in the business. Parts of the state have received more light rain this week improving wheat graze out prospects. The majority of cattle on wheat for harvest are now sold or at least penned up. Auction receipts from about mid week on are remaining steady with last weeks. Supply included 100 percent over 600 lbs and 33 percent heifers.

Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
