(04/15/09)

ALFALFA HAY: Alfalfa hay prices are steady and movement is slow. Wheat freeze damage reports are beginning to come in from across the state and the reports are "not pretty". The south-west and central areas appear to have the most damage with all other areas reporting various amounts of damage. Large amounts of wheat hay will possibly be cut and baled. Good rain covered the state this past weekend and more is in the forecast for the end of this week. Alfalfa and grass should start good growth with the moisture from the rains.

GRASS HAY: Grass hay movement is slow and prices steady. Grass hay producers welcomed the moisture this past week and spraying and fertilizing of hay meadows has started. Despite heavy snows and rains two weeks ago much of the state has plenty of dry vegetation. Many fires were reported yesterday as humidity levels dropped and winds kicked up to 70 mph. One of the biggest fire storms was reported on the eastern edge of Oklahoma City. This storm took out several homes as well as other structures.

Supply included 100 percent over 600 lbs and 23 percent heifers.

Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
