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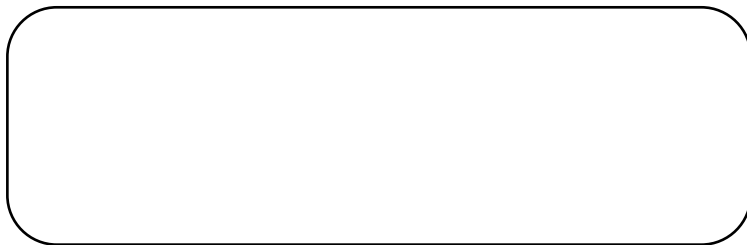

ALFALFA HAY: Alfalfa prices are steady and movement is slow. Scattered showers and cooler temperatures prevailed over the holiday weekend. Summer like temperatures have returned at mid-week. Third cutting of alfalfa is starting or will be in the next couple of weeks. Buyers continue to resist producers asking prices of alfalfa.

GRASS HAY: Grass hay movement is slow and prices are steady. Old world bluestem in western areas of the state has been slow to mature, with small amounts having been cut. Large amounts of grass hay have been cut in most other areas of the state. Grass cattle on the move as temperatures reach upper 90's and low 100's.

Supply includes 100 percent over 600 lbs; 23 percent heifers. Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
