

RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

TITLE 35. OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, FOOD, AND FORESTRY CHAPTER 15. ANIMAL INDUSTRY

(A) PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED RULE:

The proposed rule changes update the incorporation by reference of Code of Federal Regulations citations and provides clean up to the language.

(B) CLASSES OF PERSONS WHO MOST LIKELY WILL BE AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED RULE AND ANY INFORMATION ON COST IMPACTS RECEIVED BY THE AGENCY FROM ANY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITIES:

These rules affect persons who are regulated by the scrapie and contagious equine metritis animal health programs. No cost impacts have been received to date.

(C) PERSONS WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE PROPOSED RULE:

Persons who rely on the Code of Federal Regulations citations will benefit from the proposed rule.

(D) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROBABLE IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED RULE UPON AFFECTED CLASSES OF PERSONS:

All persons will benefit because of the Department's incorporation by reference because the rules governing the state and the federal programs will be identical.

No additional cost to the agency is anticipated by the rules.
