THE ENERGY STAR RATING SYSTEM:

EPA's energy performance rating system is a method that rates the performance of your building on a scale of 1 to 100.

The rating expresses the performance of your building relative to similar facilities around the US. A rating of **50** signals that your performance is in the middle of your peer group – **half of similar facilities are more efficient and half are less efficient.**

A rating of **75** indicates that your building is more efficient than 75% of buildings, in other words, **you perform in the top quartile for your peer group.** Buildings that earn a 75 or higher may be eligible to apply for the ENERGY STAR.

The rating is based on your as-billed energy consumption, and is normalized to adjust for weather and for the level of business activity (including operating hours and occupant density).
