

OKLAHOMA PUBLIC WORKS HEAVY EQUIPMENT TASK FORCES



Heavy Equipment Task Force Requirements

- Five to seven different kinds and types of resources needed for the incident 2-dozers, 2-moving trucks, 2-cherry pickers, 1-chainsaw crew (2 – personnel & truck), and operating under a designated leader with common communications between them.
- Resources can be from a single or multi-county/town area. Prevents depleting resources from any one jurisdiction
- All team leaders vehicles must have a permanently mounted radio that is compatible with all members of their team.

Heavy Equipment Strike Team

- A Strike Team consists of five to seven(5-7) resources of the same kind and type operating under a designated leader with common communications between them.
- Strike Team Leader vehicles must have a permanently mounted radio that is compatible with team members.
- Resources can be from a single or multi-county/town area. Prevents depleting resources from any one jurisdiction

Single Resources

An individual, a piece of equipment and its personnel complement, or a crew or team of individuals with an identified work supervisor that can be used on an incident.



Incident Resource Hotline Guidelines

- Volunteer response only, units are never required to respond.
- Willing to send resources to other parts of the State. (If mileage or other limitations – must be indicated with the resource listing)
- No expectation of being reimbursed for response or for lost or damaged equipment. (Except for FMAG or other Federal Disaster Declaration that allows reimbursement, if obtained)

Incident Resource Hotline Guidelines

- Resource should be listed with abilities and qualifications.
- Must have 24 hour point of contact.
- All team leader vehicles must have a permanently mounted radio that is compatible with all members of their team.
- Requested assistance is covered under the Oklahoma Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact, OK § Title 63, 695.1, Sections 3 through 13.
