ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LAWS ENFORCEMENT COMMISSION

To whom it may concern:

Last year, the Oklahoma Legislature passed House Bill 3383. Effective May 28, 2010, the revisions specifically allows military personnel to import a certain amount of alcoholic beverages into the state under specific circumstances: "No person shall... [t]ransport into, within, or through this state more than one (1) liter of alcoholic beverages upon which the Oklahoma excise tax has not been paid unless the person accompanying or in charge of the vehicle transporting same shall possess a true copy of a bill of lading, invoice, manifest or other document particularly identifying the alcoholic beverages being transported and showing the name and address of the consignor and consignee; provided, this prohibition shall not apply to the first one hundred eighty (180) liters of alcoholic beverages **classified as household goods** by military personnel, age twenty-one (21) or older when entering Oklahoma from temporary active assignment outside the contiguous United States." 37 O.S.Supp.2010, §537(A)(6).
