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Celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)


July 26, 1990-July 16, 2015

July 26 will mark the 25th anniversary of the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). In 1990, President George H. Bush signed the ADA in order to ensure all Americans living with disabilities were granted civil rights and equality.

Twenty-five years is an exciting milestone, and the ADA's support system has made sure this year's celebration reflects that. The anniversary celebration started last July with a yearlong Legacy Tour.

The ADA Legacy Bus Tour traveled across 18 states to spread awareness and create a sense of unity among those living with disabilities. The tour aims to inspire today's generation of leaders with disabilities to pursue their passions and make a difference in the Americans with disabilities community.

The Legacy Bus Tour has made stops at city halls, schools and disability organizations across the country to spread awareness of the ADA's 25th anniversary.



In addition to the Legacy Bus Tour, the ADA National Network also has several other ways for people to show support. There is an online pledge supporters can sign to express their recommitment to the ADA. The ADA Legacy Project is also selling T-shirts, wristbands, buttons and car magnets as an easy way for anyone to celebrate this historic anniversary.

Program Spotlight: The Special Education Resolution Center (SERC)

The Special Education Resolution Center (SERC) contracts with the Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE) to help parents and school districts resolve disputes regarding the special education of students. SERC provides stakeholder training in effective communication skills at the *prevention* stage of conflict. Once conflict has reached *disagreement*, SERC provides innovative programs to assist parties in resolving their differences at the earliest stage possible.

SERC provides highly trained mediators to assist the parties in coming to agreement.

For instances in which the parties are unable to come to a resolution, SERC provides a fair hearing system. Impartial and knowledgeable officers conduct administrative hearings to

settle the differences of the parties in a timely manner.

These processes are in place so that Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment will be available to Oklahoma children.

The Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) and the Consortium of Appropriate Dispute Resolution in Special Education (CADRE) have identified Oklahoma as one of four exemplar alternative dispute resolution programs in the United States.

ABLE Tech's Direct Financial Loan (up to \$1,500)

Quick & Easy Application • 5% Fixed Rate • Low Closing Cost • 12-Month Repayment

Oklahoma ABLE Tech, along with its partner the Oklahoma Assistive Technology Foundation (OkAT), is introducing **a new low interest Direct Loan option.**

The Direct Loan allows individuals with disabilities to borrow money to purchase assistive technology and specialized devices that are \$1,500 or less, at a 5% fixed interest rate with a \$15 closing fee. The low monthly payment (usually for one year) allows a qualified borrower to pay off the loan, build their credit and own the assistive technology.

This program complements the current financial loans being provided in partnership with OkAT and BancFirst to

provide financial assistance for assistive technology valued over \$1500. All loans require a qualification process, but continue to allow flexible underwriting guidelines for applicants who do not meet the typical banking loan criteria, due to credit or income issues from disability-related expenses.
