Looking for Durable Medical Equipment? Have Equipment You Want to Donate?



Oklahoma ABLE Tech partners with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to provide the Oklahoma Durable Medical Equipment Reuse Program (OKDMERP). The program is designed to reuse durable medical equipment that is no longer needed and reassign it to Oklahoma residents who are in need at no cost.

OKDMERP retrieves donated equipment; sanitizes and refurbishes devices returning them to peak performance; works with DME vendors to repair equipment if needed to ensure quality; and reassigns DME to the best matched eligible client.

Individuals may drop off or pickup equipment at the OKDMERP office located in Oklahoma City. Pickup and delivery services are free, but limited to central Oklahoma residents.
