



Accessible Voting

Help America Vote Act

Voters who have access needs play a large part in elections. Twenty percent of those participating in elections will have some kind of access need. Polling places must have accessible voting systems for persons with disabilities.

The most frequent types of disabilities are:

Difficulty standing	10.4%
Difficulty walking	9.8%
Cognitive difficulties	7.0%
Difficulty seeing	3.4%



Oklahoma is one of only five states that has an opportunity to make voting more accessible to everyone.
