Beverage Inducted into Plattsmouth Hall of Fame

Slagle Completes OBA Compliance School

Senior Examiner Terry Slagle recently completed the OBA Compliance School in Oklahoma City. The primary purpose of the course was to provide participants with the latest updates to regulatory changes affecting consumers.

Instructors covered many essential topics, such as the Regulation Z, Regulation E, Bank Secrecy Act, Flood Act, and other rules designed for consumer protection.

At the end of each day of the school, students worked in groups to address "Compliance Desk" situations posed by members of the Compliance School Faculty. The course culminated in a 60-question test on the final day of class.

Qualls Instructs at CSBS School

Senior Examiner Paul Qualls taught examiners from three states at the CSBS Credit Evaluation School. Students were instructed in the processes of which loans to review, how to review them, and the decision processes used to determine the quality of the loan reviewed.

Students also worked on simulated loans from line tickets comprised of mostly commercial real estate, residential real estate, and installment loans.

Qualls assessed the school participants on their ability to review the underwriting, servicing, and the collateral supporting the lines of credit in their line deck.

The final day of the school included a presentation regarding relevant current events from a San Jose State University professor of economics.
