

3. Respondent has failed to post a current renewal license in a prominent place at the primary location where he is engaged in the practice of chiropractic.

4. Respondent failed to complete sixteen (16) hours of continuing education in calendar year 2004.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action pursuant to 59 O.S.2001, §§161.11-161.12.

2. Any Finding of Fact, which is properly a Conclusion of Law is hereby incorporated by reference and vice versa.

3. Respondent has violated 59 O.S.2001, §161.11(A) by failing to renew his license, as set forth in the First Allegation of the Complaint.

4. Respondent has violated OAC 140:15-7-1 by failing to post a current renewal license in a prominent place at the primary location where he is engaged in the practice of chiropractic, as set forth in the Second Allegation of the Complaint.


5. Respondent has violated 59 O.S.2001, §161.11(A) by failing to complete sixteen (16) hours of continuing education in calendar year 2004, as set forth in the Third Allegation of the Complaint.

6. Based on the above Findings of Fact, the Board has authority to suspend the Respondent's license pursuant to 59 O.S.2001, §161.11(D) and 59 O.S.2001, §161.12(A)(2).

ORDER

1. Respondent is guilty of all three allegations as set forth in the Complaint.
2. Respondent's license is hereby suspended.
