1. Call Meeting to Order

Chairman Sen called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

2. Open Meeting Act Compliance

Chairman Sen verified that the meeting was being held in compliance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

3. Roll Call

Roll was taken and five members were present representing a quorum.

4. Approval of Minutes

There was no discussion

Action Taken: Chairman Sen made a motion to change agenda item eleven and list the sub-committee individuals that were created to review modifications for phase I & II. Those individuals are Chairman Sen, Earl Morrison, and Anthony Runyon. Also made a motion to approve the September 2, 2021, meeting minutes. Vice Chairman, Loughlin seconded the motion. Chairman Sen: yes; Vic-Chairman Loughlin: yes; Mr. Pauley: yes; Mr. Carroll: yes; Mr. Childers: yes; Motion carried 5 – 0.

5. Director's Report

Discussion: Director Brandon Clabes gave a summary of what has been going on at CLEET. Summary of what has been done since Director Clabes started at CLEET:

- Create a relationship with OMAG.
- Meetings with Ada Leadership.
- DOC has met with the Director and Asst. Director about having their own academy
- Non-profit organization to fund and embed a curriculum specialist and accreditation for CLEET.
- Accounting Specialist position is vacant.
- Records Management System is being updated with Thentia. Still no launch date.
- Meeting with Craig Chandler, Army University, and the Oklahoma State Board of Higher Regents regarding giving reciprocity to military police.
- Working with the Legislature on deteriorating equipment and infrastructure.
- Disciplinary cases on the rise regarding certified peace officer and security guards.
- Encouraging field representatives to work closely with academy cities, career techs and academies for feedback on curriculum.

No action required.

6. Private Security Complaints/Legal Update

General Counsel, Preston Draper, stated that the information provided in the final dispositions for the private security department as to date. Chairman Sen requested to get a copy of the peace officers final dispositions as well for all future meetings. Mr. Draper indicated that he would make sure those are provided.

7. Private Security Division Update

General Counsel, Preston Draper, made a report on behalf of the division. He discussed conversations that had been had with officials from security agencies and a security trade group representative about the amount of time it takes to review license applications. After review of the individual cases given as examples of long wait times, it was determined that one of the individuals received a license in 10 days (which is about the current average time for licensing) and the other had an incomplete application and the license was issued the day the missing materials were supplied to CLEET. He also discussed Thentia project to provide an online portal for application and other processes. The project continues having been mostly constructed but no launch date is currently scheduled.

8. SB80 – Pertaining to Legislation for 30-day temporary license being allowed by CLEET

Chairman Sent stated that Senator Dossett had sponsored SB80 in 2020 but it was never passed by both Houses. SB80 will be considered again this upcoming legislative session. There was discussion about the current language of the bill and that the 30-day time limit may not be sufficient to

accomplish the Bill's goal and that the language may need to be modified to avoid unintended consequences. Chairman Sen and CLEET's legal counsel will consult about possible language changes to suggest to the Senator.

9. Rules regarding authorized weapons for licensed armed guards and private investigators

Discussion: The committee discussed a requested rule change consideration posed by a constituent who asked for armed guards and private investigators to be allowed to carry rifles. Mr. Draper indicated that CLEET would not want to make a proposed rule change to allow armed guards and private investigators to carry rifles if the PSAC was not in favor of such a change. Chairman Sen invited each member to give his position on the matter.

Action taken: Chairman Sen made a motion that the PSAC authorize a statement in general support of amending CLEET's administrative rules to allow licensed armed security guards and licensed armed private investigators to carry rifles upon receiving appropriate training and being subject to appropriate oversight by CLEET with such training and oversight to be formalized in the future. Vice Chairman Loughlin seconded the motion. Chairman Sen: yes; Vice-Chairman Loughlin: yes; Mr. Pauley: yes; Mr. Carroll: yes; Mr. Childers: yes; Motion carried 5 –0.

Chairman Sen called for a 5-minute break at 12:07.

Chairman Sen called members back to the meeting at 12:14.

10. Phase I and II Modifications

Discussion: Chairman Sen stated that he has talked with Mr. Runyon at the career tech about the curriculum. It is in the works to obtain a curriculum from Oregon to help guide and make modifications to the new Phase I and II for Oklahoma. Chairman Sen is hoping to have more updates at the first meeting in 2022.

11. Private Security License Configuration

Discussion: Mr. Carroll would like to see if there is a way to still be able to get a security guard license and private investigator license with a picture of the individual on the card if the new system will not support the photo. Mr. Carroll wonders if OSBI could do it for a fee. Director Clabes stated that he can make an inquiry with Director Ricky Adams of the OSBI and see if this would be a possible avenue to be able to do.
