Pursuant to 59 O.S., 1750.6, an unarmed license is \$50.00 and an armed license is \$100.00. CLEET Rule 35-7-7 allowed a person to upgrade from unarmed to armed for a \$30.00 fee, which is a reduced rate. Amendments are necessary to ensure license fee for upgrading a license is equal to regular license fees. Other changes include involuntary commitment of a licensee to a mental institute or licensed private mental health facility for any mental illness as grounds for action against a license. Changes also allow CLEET to issue citations at the time of renewal of a license.
