Okla. Stat. Ann. tit. 10, 7103 (A)(1) (West Supp. 1999); tit. 10, 7104 (West 1998); tit 21, 1021.4 (West Supp. 1998)

WHO MUST REPORT

- Physicians or surgeons, including doctors of medicine and dentistry, licensed osteopathic, physicians, residents and interns, examining, attending, or treating a child; registered nurses examining, attending, or treating a child in the absence of physicians or surgeons;
- Teachers of any child;
- Commercial film and photographic print processors;
- Any other persons.

CIRCUMSTANCES

- When they have reason to believe that a child is a victim of abuse or neglect;
- When a health care professional examines, attends, or treats the victim of what appears to be criminally injurious conduct, including, but not limited to, child physical or sexual abuse.

PRIVILEGED COMMUNICATIONS

Okla. Stat. Ann. Tit 10, 7113 (West 1998)

In any proceeding resulting from a report made pursuant to the reporting laws or in any proceeding where such a report or any contents of the report are sought to be introduced into evidence, such report, contents, or other fact related thereto or to the condition of the child or victim who is the subject of the report shall not be exalted on the ground that the matter is or may be the subject of a physician patient privilege or similar privilege or rule against disclosure.

Okla. Stat. Ann. Tit 10, 7103 (c) (West Supp. 1999)

Any person who knowingly and willfully fails to promptly report any incident of child abuse or neglect, may be reported by the Department of Human Services to local law enforcement for criminal investigation and upon conviction thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Child Sexual Abuse

Intervention, Interview and Investigative Techniques Case Management

This two day training module will enhance the knowledge of Law Enforcement, Social Service Agencies, Child Protective Services and Prosecutors who have the profound responsibility of Investigating, Interviewing, Intervention and Prosecution of Child Sexual Abuse cases.

Course Objectives:

Often times there is no physical evidence to corroborate the victims story and the victim must rely on the interviewing and interrogation skills of the investigator to result in a favorable outcome by the judicial system.

Far too often the victim is victimized several times, once by the perpetrator and again by the judicial system. Because of the belief of many judges and prosecutors that a child is too young or not "competent" to testify, your job becomes much more difficult.

It is important that you, in your role as a provider of services to sexually abused victims, develop good child interviewing skills with an understanding of behavior indicators, societies attitude, social stigma and the myths about molestation.

Good interrogation skills will greatly enhance your ability to obtain a confession by the accused perpetrator and lessen the victimizing of the victim.

You will also be provided with the knowledge to recognize the characteristics and the difference between a preferential and a situational child molester. Profiling or an assessment of a pedophile with an understanding that all child molesters are not pedophiles and all ped-ophiles are not child molesters.
