- Director Clabes resigned; his official last day will be September 30th.
- Thank you to Earl Morrison for taking care of CLEET day to day operations.
- Attended a meeting with Earl Morrison at OMAG. Representatives from several groups in attendance (senators, representatives, OSA, Municipal League, FOP, OACP and OSPOA). Introduced the proposed 2023 CLEET bill – disciplinary action, establishing certification 3-year cycle (regulating process), and Continuing Education 3-year cycle.
- Commission / Certification. Commission is LE agency specific.

- CLEET online data system.
- The governor issued an executive order mandating unified statewide active shooter training taking effect 1/1/2023. DPS Commission notified CLEET the statewide training would be Law Enforcement Active Shooter Emergency Response (LASER) Training. CLEET is reviewing current curriculum (ALERRT) and learning objectives and principles of (LASER). (LASER) includes more of a focus on breaching than does ALERRT.
- CLEET will be offering rifle / shotgun training. First class October 2022.
- Reserve academies.
- Officer extension of time – 6 months.
