## **CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS**

*Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry:* Janlee Rowlett, ODAFF Legislative Liaison, stated the new legislative session will begin today with the Governor's State of the State address at 12:30pm. She noted that she is excited to begin working with the Oklahoma Conservation Commission again.

*Natural Resources Conservation Service:* Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

-Bryan Painter compiled a comprehensive partnership report that is included in the Commissioner's packets. These reports are available every quarter.

-EQIP's ranking tool "CART" is available.

-NRCS's budget is now available. The budget includes twenty-six million dollars in funds for the EQIP program.

-NRCS has taken an active role in the streamlining efforts of the cost share program. One method in achieving the goal is to remove the mandate for "resource concerns" in approving applications. Guidance on this will be available today, February 3, 2020.

-6 NRCS employees are participating in the Tristate Leadership Class.

*Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts:* Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director, gave the following update:

-State Meeting planning is going well. Ms. Blaney expects to have an exciting program.

-The Mike Thralls Memorial Scholarship application deadline is March 27, 2020.

-Conservation Day is scheduled for April 15, 2020, at the State Capitol.

-Ms. Blaney will be partnering with Amy Seiger, OCC Soil Health Coordinator, and Kevin Mink, Oklahoma County Conservation District Urban Soil Health Planner, to deliver a presentation at NACD's Annual Meeting in Las Vegas, Nevada.

## **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS**

Mr. Jett attended a Fire Protection Analysis Meeting. Their goal is to set up emergency fire command centers and outfit water wells to aid fire truck tankers.

Mr. Campbell stated that he attended the No Till on the Plains Seminar in Wichita, Kansas.

Mr. Herriman stated that he did not have a report.

Mr. Clark stated that he did not have a report. However, he stated that he was pleased about the developments on the ranking system in the cost share program.

Mr. Forst stated that his home district, Jefferson Conservation District, hired a new

secretary. He is hopeful that it will work out well for everyone.

#### **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF**

*Executive Director:* Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- He worked with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry on the Governor's Variance Analysis Report mandate.
- He made a presentation at the Kansas State Association of Watershed Districts meeting in Topeka, Kansas.
- Mr. Lam attended the No Till on the Plains seminar in Wichita, Kansas. He noted that there were many NRCS employees from Oklahoma attending.

*Water Quality Program:* Shanon Phillips reported on the following items:

- The division will begin providing training opportunities to the Chickasaw and Choctaw Water Quality Monitoring staff.
- Attended an Illinois River planning meeting.
- Blue Thumb hosts "mini-academies" with school teachers and/or scout leaders. They have produced approximately two-hundred and eighty water quality monitoring volunteers.
- Attended the division's Water Quality Retreat.
- The division will begin using the Conservation Districts' Long Range Plans to help them achieve some of the goals outlined within.

*Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services:* Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He noted the following item:

- He is still working to try and resolve the anti-phishing ban and no-click policy that OMES has placed on our communication capabilities. He noted that districts seem to be having the most trouble with the new policy. He stated that district and agency employees must specifically add email address to OMES's "white list" to be considered acceptable for link usage.
- Submitted a request for guidance from the Attorney General on county boundaries, as it has 911 implications.

*Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program:* Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: The Enable Emergency remediation was completed; two (2) projects are under construction in Rogers County; two (2) projects in Haskell County are in contracting for construction; four (4) projects are being monitored for vegetative management and maintenance; one (1) project is on hold pending ABB survey next year; three (3) projects are in design; four (4) projects are in realty phase; five (5) projects are in environmental review.

*Conservation Programs:* Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Ms. Sawatzky reported the following items:

- Cost Share Program guidelines are now available for use.
- Mrs. Sawatzky stated that they will commence rehab projects in a couple of months.

*District Services:* Lisa Knauf Owen, Director, stated that a written report was in their

packet and reported on the following items:

- Attended board meetings in Cotton, Jackson, and Kay counties. The division has another 20 board meetings scheduled to attend in February and March.
- Assisted Director Lam on the Governor's Variance Report.
- Attended a Commissioners of Land Office meeting to discuss prescribed fire.
- Preparing for the upcoming District Director Elections.
- Assisting districts with their end of year tax preparations and payroll forms.




## Conservation Planner Award Profile – Laura Schnapp

The connection between a producer and his or her land is a special bond. These individuals are proud of it, they protect it and they nurture it. Laura Schnapp, Soil Conservationist in Team 9 out of the NRCS Stillwater Field Office, has a very meaningful way of looking at that. “What I enjoy most about working with producers is not only the unique opportunity to be invited out to their property, but the relationships I develop along the way, as they share their stories about how they have curated a life with the land,” Schnapp said. “What interests me the most is learning about ecosystem processes and how our management decisions effect our natural resources.” A special invitation that’s how Schnapp views a request for assistance from a producer. “I have several personal approaches that I deploy depending on the situation,” Schnapp said. “Some include: enthusiasm, perseverance, being a team player, and task oriented.

Most of my approaches are simply how I am wired. Others stem from my work ethic instilled from a very young age and my curiosity about how I can best be a part of, not only my community, but the natural world around me.” Connection and dedication to producers is crucial to me effectively doing my job, Schnapp said. “It takes both of these in order to develop trust and it’s only through trust that they may be willing to try different management strategies that will ultimately improve our natural resources and quality of life for all living organisms.”



## MOU Signing

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) on Nov. 6, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to improve tribes’ and tribal members’ access to farm conservation programs to advance conservation in Indian Country. The MOU was signed in Catoosa, Oklahoma, where USDA Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation Bill Northey was joined by BIA Director Darryl LaCounte at the Indian Nations Conservation Alliance - National Tribal Conservation Districts Conference, organized by the Indian Nations Conservation Alliance. This MOU signing represents the Trump Administration’s continued commitment to Indian Country. The MOU enables USDA’s Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and Farm Service Agency (FSA) to partner with BIA to improve assistance to American Indians and Alaska Natives in identifying and addressing the agricultural, conservation and economic needs of tribal communities on Indian lands.



This creates a foundation for improved coordination, training, planning and implementation of USDA programs on tribal lands. The five-year agreement also will enhance USDA and BIA’s efforts to promote best management practices for Indian lands, including the development of rural business opportunities, the management of farm and ranching operations, infrastructure development and stewardship of environmental, cultural and natural resources on Indian lands. NRCS Chief Matt Lohr and FSA Administrator Richard Fordyce also participated in the signing.



# Conservation Planner Award Profile – Greg Allen



Allen was born in Enid in northern Oklahoma, but was raised at Antlers in the southeastern area of the state. When Greg Allen of Idabel got out of the pickup at a producer's place his focus wasn't bogged down by any problems. He was already coming up with solutions in his mind. Part of that came from the fact that he wasn't looking at a customer with an issue, he was standing face-to-face with a neighbor who needed some help. The wording on the Conservation Planner Award he recently received, said, "In appreciation of your excellent conservation planning assistance to farmers and ranchers. Your high level of technical assistance is appreciated and is making a difference to our customers."

One key to that type of service is that he didn't let the phone get cold. "When a request came in for assistance or for a plan, I got to it just as quick as I could," said Allen, who was a Soil Conservation Technician on Team 21 in the Idabel Field Office in the East Zone. That approach to his job was just something he developed on his own, however, there were other aspects to his job that were learned by not only listening, but watching.


# Lincoln County Locally Led Conference and SurveyMonkey

## Engineering Bootcamp

The 20th Session of the Engineering for Conservation Planning training course (aka Engineering Bootcamp) is drawing near, scheduled for May 18-22. Every session generates memories, and 2019 was an outstanding example. The 19th session was held May 20-24, 2019 at the USDA-ARS Hydraulics Lab near Stillwater, Oklahoma. Twelve students participated in the training course. During this weeklong course, they were introduced to many facets of Oklahoma NRCS engineering. For example, the students were taught basic surveying skills during field exercises and introduced to hydrology and hydraulic concepts that can be used to plan, design, and implement many different conservation practices. Their knowledge was tested near the end of the course though a field review, affectionately known as the Conservation Olympics. Stillwater, along with many other parts of Oklahoma, experienced a historic rainfall event during the course. The course had great participation from the students and the instructors. Without everyone's extra efforts, this course could not have been a success.



# Oklahoma Organic Conference

The Oklahoma Organic Conference held at the OSU-Oklahoma City campus was a success with presenters including Gilbert Guerrero of NRCS, and Ray Moranz of Xerces. While Guerrero shared information about the Farm Bill, Moranz spoke on the very popular topic of Monarch Habitat. Topics covered throughout the day included Integrating cover crops into vegetable production, using cover crops for agronomic systems, soil improvement through cover crops and cover crops for soil improvement and crop protection. Nearly three dozen people were in attendance and feedback was very positive.



## 2019 Engineer of the Year








## Farmer uses aerial approach to planting cover crops in October


Torrential rains fell in May and radish, turnip and cereal rye seeds fell in October over Scotty Herriman's farm near South Coffeyville, Okla. Recently Herriman stood in his soybean field about a half mile from the Verdigris River in northeastern Oklahoma as an airplane buzzed over top, about 40 feet up, dropping a cover crop mix of radishes, turnips and cereal rye upon the soybeans and the 70-year-old producer. The water back in May 2019 was about 8 feet deep in his fields. His corn, knee high before the rains, was gone. Portions of some stalks, a few cobs and even the shell of a native mussel were about all that was left. However, he'd made a commitment back in March or April through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Environmental Quality Incentives Program to plant cover crops, and his window of opportunity had just about shut and locked. He had drilled the cover crop seed on about 80 acres of already harvested upland corn, but with time of the essence, he called a flying service from nearby Miami, Okla., so that he could fly the seed in on just under 480 acres of the beans.



Within two and a half hours they had seeded 472 acres, and that time span included a trip for each back to Miami to load back up with seed. Herriman's 25-pound cover crop mix consists of 2 pounds of turnips, 3 pounds of radishes and 20 pounds of cereal rye. The only way I would have done this and could have done this is with the help of NRCS," Herriman said. "Their EQIP Program that promotes the use of cover crops, allows us the opportunity to get federal monies to try some of these things. With that three-year contract that I'm in, that's exactly what we're doing. We're making it happen." Herriman and Julie Lamb, NRCS Resource Conservationist in the Nowata Field Office, were interviewed on Good Day Tulsa on KTUL ABC 8 in Tulsa to talk about EQIP and other programs.
