John Mueller, Natural Resources Conservation Service Acting State Conservationist, presented Mr. Parker with a plaque.

## **PRESENTATION REGARDING THE OKLAHOMA PRESCRIBED BURN ASSOCIATION**

Darrel Dominick, Tribal Liaison, reported on an agreement that was signed with the Noble Foundation and the Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Association. He provided a copy of the press release announcing the partnership (see Attachment A).

This Association, which formed a 501(3)(c) earlier this year, and the Noble Foundation will be working closely with the Commission, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Natural Resources Conservation Service as well as Oklahoma State University to promote prescribed burning to improve Oklahoma's grazing lands. Mr. Dominick stated that the Nature Conservancy has been very helpful by providing \$10,000 to the Association.

Mr. Dominick stated that the NRCS and OSU is assisting with a three tier training being offered for producers. Tier 1 is an on-line training, Tier 2 is seminar training and Tier 3 is on the ground training.

Mr. Dominick stated there are currently 16 local prescribed burn associations but additional partnerships are being formed. He stated that the Association will also be working on a regional level with an alliance for prescribed burns that includes Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

John Weir, Oklahoma State University Department of Natural Resource Ecology and Management Research Associate, appreciates the support of the Commission and the Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts, as well as all the partnerships. He stated that a local burn

association is formed by a group of local landowners for the purpose of pooling resources and getting fire on the land. He stated that fire is just as important to the land as rainfall. It impacts the soil, native plants, wildlife and livestock. The Association will work with rural fire departments as well as county commissioners on prescribed burns.

#### **PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS**

Ben Pollard, Assistant Director, presented the amended agreement for approval as listed in Exhibit #3 and recommended its approval. A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the amended agreement as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, Lowrance and Grego. Nay votes: none. #### **CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS**

*Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry:* Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, stated that she enjoyed Conservation Day at the Capitol. Ag Day at the Capitol is April 4 with a media event at 9:00 a.m. for a special announcement regarding improved water quality in Oklahoma. She stated that Mr. John Hughes from Bartlesville is the Ag Hall of Fame recipient.

Ms. Arthur stated that the drought bill sponsored by Senator Justice passed out of committee this morning.

*USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service:* John Mueller, Acting State Conservationist,

provided the monthly Partnership Report (See Attachment B). He reported that NRCS awards were presented during the OACD state meeting.

Mr. Mueller reported on funding issues stating that the U.S. Department of Agriculture will take an additional 2.5% to 2.7% cut over and above the reductions received under sequestration. He then reported on watershed rehabilitation stating that two sites are under construction. He stated that the NRCS provided testimony in district court on a high hazard dam in eastern Oklahoma.

Mr. Mueller stated that no word has been received regarding the new state conservationist for Oklahoma. However, he expressed his appreciation for the support he has received while serving as acting State Conservationist in Oklahoma.

*Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts:* Kim Farber, President, thanked everyone for attending Conservation Day at the Capitol and expressed appreciation to the Commission for its assistance.

#### **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS**

Mr. Stunkard stated that the Wagoner County Soil Stewardship Breakfast is being planned.

Mr. Rooker attended the 58<sup>th</sup> annual Murray County Conservation District banquet.

Mr. Jett attended the 60<sup>th</sup> annual Conservation Fair hosted by the Grant County Conservation District with well over 200 people. He reported on attending a public meeting in Woodward regarding the Clean Lines Energy transmission project and the route it will follow from Hitchland, Texas to Tennessee. Mr. Jett also attended a meeting sponsored by the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation and the OACD regarding the prairie chicken initiative.

Mr. Grego reported that his area received seven inches of rain during March. He attended his high school reunion and noted two state senators were in attendance that graduated from Wilburton high school.

Mr. Lowrance attended the NACD Fly-In and assisted in presenting Nicole Scott, U.S. House Ag Committee Chief of Staff, the OACD Hall of Fame Award. The group also met with Oklahoma's congressional delegation.

#### **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF**

*Administration - Executive Director:* Mr. Thralls expressed appreciation to Mr. Mueller for his work as Acting State Conservationist.

Mr. Thralls stated that the drought bill heard today would provide funding for assistance only during droughts. Staff continues to talk to house and senate appropriation chairmen regarding operational funds for the Commission.

*District Services Division:* Lisa Knauf Owen, Director, stated that a written report was included in the meeting packet. She reported that Fredia Rice, Cotton County Conservation District Secretary, is retiring effective April 30.

*Water Quality Program:* Shanon Phillips, Director, stated that a written report was in the packet. She stated that on Thursday an announcement will be made that once again Oklahoma is ranking high in nonpoint source nutrient reduction of both nitrogen and phosphorous.

*Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program:* Mike Kastl, Director, reported on an additional emergency as listed in his written report included in the meeting packet. He stated that the NSU project in the third month of a 14 month contract.

*Financial Management and Human Resources Division:* Mr. Coffman reported that districts have been asked to compile information for the renewal of the district liability insurance policy. A written report is in the meeting packet.

*Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services:* Mike Sharp, Director, stated that a written report is in the meeting packet. He recognized Shellie Willoughby, GIS Specialist, for her work with the recent GIS Day at the Capitol.

*Conservation Programs Division:* Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report is in the meeting packet. He reported that due to open district positions in western Oklahoma, the Commission detailed watershed technicians and aides to assist the area with watershed issues.

Mr. Toole thanked Mr. Sharp for his assistance in accessing GIS information. As a result, the Commission was recently able to provide to a district watershed dam mapping assistance to help them deal with Call Okie ticket issues.

*Administration - Assistant Director:* Mr. Pollard expressed appreciation to Commission staff, OACD board and staff members, NRCS staff, and OACDE for assistance with Conservation Day. He said holding the awards ceremony in the House Chambers worked well. He also expressed appreciation to OACD for combining Prescribed Burn Day and he thanked Mr. Dominick and Mr. Weir for their work.

Mr. Pollard yielded time to Paula Templeton, Oklahoma Association of Conservation District Employees Vice President. Ms. Templeton expressed appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Joe Parker for including the OACDE in OACD activities, as well as the Commission and NRCS staff.

### **State organizations unite to promote prescribed burns**

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. — The Noble Foundation entered into a strategic relationship today with the Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Association (OPBA) to advance the use of prescribed fire as a safe, economical and effective land management practice in Oklahoma.

To recognize the importance of land stewardship and the role of prescribed burn, the OPBA, the Noble Foundation and this strategic relationship were recognized in a special ceremony today on the floor of the House of Representatives as part of the annual Conservation Day activities at the State Capitol in Oklahoma City.

The OPBA and the Noble Foundation, the largest independent nonprofit agricultural research organization in the United States, agreed that the Noble Foundation would provide essential support (resources and personnel) to enable the conduct of OPBA operations and programs. As part of this support, Russell Stevens, Noble Foundation wildlife and fisheries consultant, will serve as coordinator and acting head of the OPBA.

"The goals of the OPBA align with the Noble Foundation's mission to promote responsible stewardship of the land," said Bill Buckner, president and CEO of the Noble Foundation. "Prescribed burns are vital to ensuring the health and vitality of our native rangeland and farmlands, and Oklahoma is now poised to provide a comprehensive resource to our landowners."

The OPBA was formally established as a nonprofit in early 2013 after two years of statewide meetings to gauge interest and garner support from all key organizations. The OPBA will establish, educate and assist a statewide network of local burn associations across Oklahoma. The new nonprofit will also serve to educate the public and policymakers about the need to use prescribed fire and the safety of this management practice.

As research has shown, fire is a natural part of the ecological process and is necessary for rejuvenating the land. Prescribed fires (or controlled burns) are carefully choreographed and planned activities that target specific areas for this purpose. The use of prescribed fire enhances grassland and forest land, reduces fuel loads that threaten public safety (due to uncontrollable wildfires), and reduces and manages brush species detrimental to public health.

"The formation of the OPBA is one of the most important steps to help landowners reclaim the Oklahoma landscape naturally," said John Weir, research associate with Oklahoma State University Department of Natural Resource Ecology and Management. "The OPBA will provide landowners with a clearinghouse of information, training and funding opportunities to help them safely and effectively apply fire to their lands."

The OPBA brings together dozens of organizations, including the Nature Conservancy, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission (OCC) and its 88 local conservation districts, the Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts (OACD), the Oklahoma Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation, Playa Lakes Joint Venture, the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC), Oklahoma State University Extension, Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Advisory Council, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the USDA's Natural Resource Conservation Service.

"Collaboration is one of the keys to success," said Darrel Dominick, tribal outreach coordinator with OCC. "We have built a strong coalition of reputable organizations, all focused on improving the land and supporting landowners. This is a good day for Oklahoma."

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The 75<sup>th</sup> Annual State Meeting of the Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts (OACD) began on Sunday, February 24, and was scheduled to run until noon on Tuesday, February 26, but ended early due to impending weather. More than 320 initially registered for the meeting but by the Monday luncheon the crowd had dwindled to 225. However, the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) was able to present their Partnership Awards. John Mueller, Acting State Conservationist for NRCS Oklahoma and Gary O'Neill, Assistant State Conservationist for Operations presented four awards: Conservation Educator, Standing in the Gap, Conservation District Director and Conservationist of the Year.

**Conservation Educator** was awarded to Susan Henning, Kay County Conservation District. Susan conducts classroom presentation in 13 schools in Oklahoma and coordinates a Natural Resource Day in constructed Outdoor Classrooms behind the USDA Service Center in Kay County every year. She works very hard to make sure that it is a positive educational experience for the children attending. Susan also sends out Program Information to all Newspapers in Kay County and develops News Articles to educate the public. Susan is a big help in the area of Education of the different Programs which is so important to spreading the word of Conservation.


Ed Crall, Caddo County Conservation District Project Coordinator was honored for his contributions in restoring the Sugar Creek Watershed. Ed Crall has bridged the gap between NRCS, Landowners and Conservation Districts and has made significant conservation progress through hard work and innovation. Mr. Crall has worked hard to secure funding from the NRCS national office to support the priorities of the Conservation District and help farmers and ranchers address critical erosion concerns adjacent to streams. Over \$1.5 million of restoration work has taken place in the Sugar Creek Watershed. His work has resulted in the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and the NRCS being able to effectively supplement the initial efforts of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).



Andrew Qualls, Muskogee County Conservation District Technician, has clearly been the role of the Standing in the Gap. During the period the office was without a District Secretary, Andy continued to carry out his normal work tasks and stepped up to fill the gap in clerical duties. Andy sent out more than 1000 quarterly newsletters to local producers who were very appreciative of being informed of the various programs and information available to them. Andy also provides customer assistance by directing walk-ins to the appropriate agency or assisting them with Farm Bill contract management issues, such as contacting producers and advising them of the status of their conservation activities, obtaining signatures and general filing. Andy also took the lead in Watershed Operation and Maintenance by inspecting dams and addressing resource concerns throughout the year. Not only does he address issues as they arise, he also conducts the annual inspections thoroughly and forwards unresolved issues to the applicable recipients. 


**Director of the Year** was awarded to Dean Graumann, Greer County Conservation District. Dean has exercised his leadership skills to progress the conservation movement many different levels throughout the past year plus. As a farmer/rancher, Dean is both an advocate and example of conservation through his persistent work in No-Till Farming. Many area farmers routinely call upon Dean to share information about the No-Till practices that he implements on his own land. Dean has been actively involved with efforts throughout the area to advance the adoption of conservation friendly practices such as his key involvement with the Southern Plains Agricultural Resources Coalition (SPARC), which focuses on improving soil quality among its other key goals. **Conservationist of the Year** was awarded to the Board Members of the Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Advisory Council. These individuals have gone beyond their regular duties and responsibilities to serve as volunteer board member for OTCAC that has a mission to promote the conservation and preservation of natural resources (Mother Earth) on American Indian land through a process of exercising sovereign rights for American Indians. Over the past year OTCAC has organized, facilitated, sponsored and actively been involved in the delivery of 33 outreach meetings that have provided the following information and training to agriculture producers across the state of Oklahoma; hands on conservation workshops, on farm demonstrations, Farm Bill programs, conservation days, conservation workshops designed to meet the needs of all 39 Tribes of Oklahoma and local producers, prescribed burn training and Agriculture Shows. OTCAC is truly a strong conservation partner to state and federal agencies and tribes; however, their conservation efforts are not limited to agriculture producers, they have made huge contributions to our youth and communities in need. Last year OTCAC sponsored the following; five scholarships to students seeking degrees in the field of environmental sciences and engineering, two science camps for two rural community schools, assisted three students to purchase college books and sponsored a free Thanksgiving dinner in a rural community. The Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Advisory board members include: Art Muller, Darrell Dominick, Ben Pollard, Clay Pope and PJ Workman. Art Muller accepted the award for OTCAC.



## OUTREACH REVIEW

The Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Council (OTCAC) and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) partnered with the Wisconsin Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (WTCAC) and the Indian Nations Conservation Alliance (INCA) held a multi-state Tribal, tribal member and producer conservation training and USDA programs workshop. Other partners included; USDA Risk Management, USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA), USDA Rural Development, USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), USDA Animal Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), Oklahoma Conservation Commission (OCC) and US Fish & Wildlife Services (USFW). The workshop was held from March 4<sup>th</sup> through March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2013, at the Citizen Potawatomi Nation (CPN) located at 1601 S. Gordon Cooper, in Shawnee Oklahoma. The meeting was held in the Citizen Potawatomi Nation Reunion Hall #1, on CPN tribal grounds with traditional opening and closing prayers being offered by Justin Neely, CPN and NRCS American Indian Alaskan Native Employee Association (AIANEA) Elder, Ted Herrera.


The USDA program workshop focused on providing attendees valuable information on USDA programs to Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico and Montana tribes, tribal members and local producers. Under the provisions of the Oklahoma Public Competitive Bidding Act (Title 61 - Section 130), Mike Thralls, as chief administrative officer for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, has the authority to declare an emergency.

Whenever the chief administrative officer declares an emergency, he/she shall notify the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and the State Construction Administrator, Division of Capitol Assets Management, Office of Management Enterprise Services, of such action within 10 days. Such notification shall contain a statement of the reasons for the action, and shall be recorded in the official minutes of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission.

Reasons for Emergency Declaration:


This project addressed an emergency situation involving the sudden collapse of an underground coal mine, creating a dangerous Vertical Opening (VO) under a house. The VO is approximately 12 feet in surface diameter and 12 feet deep. It has vertical sides and has active erosion taking dirt deeper underground into the mine void underneath.

The site is in a residential neighborhood of McAlester, Oklahoma (population 18,383). There is a high probability of harm to persons living in the house and workers repairing the house.

Location:

It is located in the SW¼ SW¼ of Section 30, Township 6 North, Range 15 East in Pittsburg County (McAlester, USGS Quadrangle), Oklahoma. The geographic coordinates are 34.9573 degrees latitude north and -95.7672 degrees longitude west. The site is located at 2807 N. Pine Street in McAlester, Oklahoma.

The VO was approximately 12 feet in surface diameter and 12 feet deep. It had vertical sides and active erosion taking dirt deeper underground into the mine void underneath.

The site is in a residential neighborhood of McAlester, Oklahoma (population 18,383). There was a high probability of harm to persons living in the house and workers repairing the house.

The project was completed on March 8, 2013, by Marks Construction, LLC for 5,375.00.
