The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, June 1, 2015, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Karl Jett. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Herriman led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the minutes of the May 4, 2015 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Steve Coffman, Financial Management Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF COMMISSION EMPLOYEES

Lisa Knauf Owen, Assistant Director, recognized Tammy Sawatzky, Conservation Programs Director, for 30 years of service and presented her with a certificate and pin.

Karla Spinner, Awards and Recognition Committee Chair, stated that Stacey Day, Senior Technical Writer for the Water Quality Division, was named Employee of the Quarter during the full staff meeting on May 27.

Ms. Spinner also recognized Ms. Owen for being named Employee of the Year during the full staff meeting on May 27.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Trey Lam, Executive Director, stated that staff from the Water Quality Program and the Office of Geographic Information was recognized at Quality Team Day during Public Service Recognition Week for receiving the Governor's Commendation of Excellence and "Cutting through the Red Tape" Award for their work on an interactive map that provides accessible stream information to Oklahomans. Those recognized from Water Quality were: Shanon Phillips, Brooks Tramell, Stacey Day, Stacy Hansen, Robert Hathorne. Those recognized from the OGITS were: Mike Sharp and Shellie Willoughby.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Ms. Owen presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She stated that the agreement listed as (a) was previously approved by Mr. Jett and she recommended ratification of approval. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to ratify approval of the agreement listed as (a). Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand.

Ms. Owen then recommended continuing agreements listed as (b) and (c) for FY2016. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Mr. Lam presented travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the requests as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

Kim Tweed, Executive Secretary, presented the recommendations for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR POSITION #2

Ms. Tweed presented information from the recent filing period for District Director Position #2 as listed in Exhibit #5. She stated that Mr. Lam, as authorized by the Commission, approved eligibility of those listed in the Exhibit and recommended certifying these individuals as elected to Position #2 as they were the only eligible person filing a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy. Ms. Tweed also stated that there were four districts where no one filed and one district where two candidates filed. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to declare those listed in Exhibit #5 as elected to Position #2. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: None. Motion carried.

AUTHORIZE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO DECLARE CANDIDATES RECEIVING HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES AS ELECTED

Ms. Tweed stated that on Tuesday, June 2, an election will be held in the Noble County Conservation District. She requested that the Commission authorize the Executive Director to declare the candidate receiving the highest number of votes during the election as elected to Position #2. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the authorization as requested. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: None. Motion carried.

NACD SOUTH CENTRAL REGION MEETING

Mr. Lam stated that the National Association of Conservation Districts South Central Region Meeting will be held in Catoosa, Oklahoma on August 9-11, 2015 and would like discussion on member attendance at the meeting. Those expressing an interest in attending were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Mr. Lam stated that Bill Clark, incoming Area 5 member, will be attending. Registration and reservations will be made as indicated.

DISCUSSION OF THE COMMISSION'S FY2016 APPROPRIATION AND BUDGET

Members were provided a handout of the General Revenue Summary (See Attachment A). Mr. Lam stated that the Commission received a total GR reduction in the amount of 3.94%; however, when the Conservation Bond payment is removed, which was held harmless, the cut amounts to 4.96% which equals \$405,000. The Commission received zero dollars for watershed rehabilitation which would serve as match for federal rehab dollars. Mr. Lam stated that the Commission will not be renewing the Tulsa Outreach Coordinator agreement. Two vacant fulltime positions, due to retirements, in the Valliant Conservation District will not be filled. The Commission has three positions that will not be filled this fiscal year.

Mr. Lam stated that division budget meetings are scheduled this month and he will be asking divisions to decrease their budgets by four to five percent. He stated that the Commission will need to examine how to deliver conservation in Oklahoma with shared employees as well as looking at shared employees within the Commission.

Mr. Jett stated that we need to look at the long-term budget and that all members will need to have a part in those discussions. Mr. Lam stated that the budget numbers should be ready by the August Commission meeting. He stated that due to the possibility of rescissions in this coming fiscal year the Commission may need to consider making a six month allocation to districts for director meeting expense and operating expense and revisit the district allocations in five to six months.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

NEW BUSINESS

Rod Wanger, Farm Service Agency, Conservation Programs, appeared before the Commission to provide an update of activities. Mr. Wanger stated that the Conservation Reserve Program will have a general signup from December through February. He reported on the Emergency Conservation Program stating it is a cost-share program to assist with damaged structures such as fences, barns, etc. He stated that cooperators in flood prone areas are not eligible for the program.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: This report was moved to later on the agenda.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, stated that the Emergency Watershed Program will have funding available to assist with flood damage in counties that have a Presidential Declaration. To date those are Grady, Cleveland and Oklahoma Counties. This program could assist with repairs to emergency spillways on a 75/25 match with the 25 being in-kind.

Mr. O'Neill stated that rankings for the Conservation Stewardship Program are being finalized for funding. He stated that instead of one large pool it is being done by the 12 team boundaries.

The U.S. Secretary of Agriculture announced that the Client Gateway is now available. Producers can use it for program signups, to request information, to request financial and/or technical assistance, to review and submit contract information, etc. There is also a 1-800 number for technical assistance.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, reported that the recent National Land and Range Judging Contest was a success. There were over 650 kids from 35 states participating. He expressed appreciation to the NRCS and the Commission for their assistance with the contest. He stated that work continues with the NACD South Central meeting.

Mr. House stated that the Creek Nation voted to sponsor OACD's soil health program during the NACD South Central Region Meeting. He also reported that the Kirkpatrick Foundation will provide financial assistance to OACD at the same level as last year. Mr. House stated that OACD will be sending out dues information to districts and will include a request for financial assistance for its soil health initiative as well.

OACD staff continues to work on the Regional Conservation Partnership Program demonstration farms. He also reported on the three Conservation Incentive Grant applications for soil health and invasive species.

Mr. House commended Don Armes on his efforts to minimize budget reductions to the Commission.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Ms. LeGrand reported on watershed structures in her district stating that they are working good after receiving over 27" of rain in the last weeks. She thanked Ms. Tweed for accompanying her to her Senate Confirmation Hearing held recently and reported that she has been confirmed by the full senate. Ms. LeGrand attended the retirement reception for Yuel Farris.

Mr. Rooker attended the National Land and Range Judging Contest banquet.

Mr. Jett reported on attending a "Managing Drought and Recover on the Ranch" meeting and said it was well attended. He also stated that due to all the rains the drought is over.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated that Roger Mills County is a model for how watershed structures work. He stated that Nena Wells, Upper Washita Conservation District Manager, is doing an excellent job and that directors regularly go out to look at structures. This flooding event came in the midst of a drought which is typical of all past drought events.

Mr. Lam attended the National Land and Range Judging Contest and stated it was an excellent event. He stated that the Secretary of Agriculture and members of the Agriculture Board attended as well.

Mr. Lam stated that staff met with the Valliant and Little River Conservation District boards regarding consolidation. They have also approached the Kiamichi board.

Mr. Lam attended the National Watershed Coalition Conference in Fort Worth, Texas and stated it was a timely meeting with all the flooding.

Mr. Lam will be meeting with the new Area 5 member, Bill Clark on Friday. He thanked George Stunkard, Wagoner County Conservation District director, for inviting him to their Soil Stewardship Breakfast

Mr. Lam commended Ms. Tweed on her work with the district director election process.

Mr. Lam stated that field days have been scheduled in June and July for legislators and their families, district directors and staff to discuss water quality, flood control, and cost-share. Dates of the field days are as follows: June 12 - Crow Creek, Tulsa; June 19-Spiro; June 26-Medicine Park; July 10-Martin Nature Park, Oklahoma City; and July 17-Turkey Creek, Enid.

Mr. Lam stated that Mike Sharp arranged for a Oklahoma Highway Patrol helicopter tour for him and Representative Leslie Osborne to look at flood control structures from El Reno to Elk City.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated that staff is busy collecting water samples in places that haven't had water in a long period of time. She stated that the Blue Thumb Program staff reached over 2800 people last month.

Ms. Phillips reported on soil health and stated that training has been held for Adair County, Cherokee County and Sequoyah County and is scheduled for Delaware County, Dewey County, Nowata County, Okmulgee County, Payne County, Kiamichi, Jefferson County and Garfield County Conservation Districts.

Mr. Jett questioned the North Canadian River Program and Ms. Phillips stated that the project will wrap-up this fall.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. Staff was very busy assisting the Emergency Operations Center this past month.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report in the packet. He stated that the May rain has prevented completion of scheduled vegetation of reclaimed AML sites as well as completion of construction on at least one site. He reported the AML Emergency Coordinator Henry Roye had been receiving a higher than usual number of calls to investigate potential AML emergencies. AML staff anticipate that as conditions dry it will result in more calls reporting subsidence and potential AML emergencies.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, provided copies of a written report. She reported that due to statewide flooding watershed sites have been watched over the past weeks and that all sites have functioned as designed and built. She stated that 133 sites had spillway flow. Of that number 21 have some kind of damage and of those 3-4 have significant damage. She expressed appreciation to conservation district staff who spent Memorial Day weekend checking the sites to ensure they were functioning properly. The watershed techs and aides were assisting districts and NRCS staff as well.

Ms. Sawatzky thanked the National Watershed Coalition for inviting Commission staff on a helicopter tour to survey watershed damage. The tour included Beckham, Roger Mills, Custer and Washita Counties. Information on damage will be provided to the NRCS in hopes of receiving EWP funds for repairs. She thanked Robert Hathorne and Stacy Hansen for distributing press releases and information during the floods.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. Ms. Owen stated that with a \$600 million shortfall this year and with over a one billion dollar shortfall predicted next year

that it presents challenges for the Commission. We will have to find creative alternative ways of doing business. She extended a thank you to Ms. Sawatzky, the NRCS as well as the watershed techs and aides for their work with the watershed structures during recent floods.

Ms. Owen stated that she is advising districts not to use an auditor in southeast Oklahoma due to length of time in completing audits for districts.

Ms. Owen attended the Little River, Valliant and Kiamichi board meetings this past month. She stated that consolidation is not easy nor quick but she is hopeful a positive conclusion will take place.

OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, FOOD AND FORESTRY REPORT

Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, introduced Gatlin Squires as their OSU intern stating he is from Kingfisher.

Ms. Arthur stated that the Department received a 4.5% cut for FY2016. They are searching for \$1.2 million. Secretary Reese has stated that there will be no furloughs nor Reductions-in-Force. She stated several divisions cannot take another cut. Ms. Arthur also expressed that due to next year's budget there is no way to do what they do if more cuts are received. She stated that Natural Resources agencies are down on the list of priorities and that four personalities decide how the state budget is formed.

Ms. Arthur reported that Ag Day 2016 has been scheduled for March 30.

Ms. Arthur stated that a special cabinet meeting is scheduled for Tuesday to discuss flooding, roads, bridges, etc. She stated that Beaver's Bend State Park is a mess and that the Forestry Division will be assisting with bulldozer work.

Ms. Arthur reported that Richard Gephart, President of the Cattlemen's Association passed away and services are pending.

OFFICERS FOR FY2016

Mr. Jett stated that if no object the Commission will rotate officers as follows: Area 2-Chair, Mike Rooker; Area 3-Vice Chair, Scotty Herriman; and Area 4-Secretary, Deanna LeGrand. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve officers as listed above. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: None. Motion carried.

NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission is scheduled for Wednesday, July 8, 2015, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m. Mr. Lam is requesting that the meeting be changed to Thursday, July 9, 2015 in the Agriculture Lab Conference Room. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the change of date and location as presented. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: None. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to adjourn. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 11:18 a.m.

Coordinated Partnership with the Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (OTCAC) -

- I am currently working with OPBA to provide the Creek Nation Conservation Commission with prescribed fire equipment, such as an equipped burn trailer, and access to training. OPBA leadership has agreed to move this relationship forward. Discussed other partnership opportunities with Ed Mouss, Chairperson.
- I continue working with OTCAC and Carol Crouch, NRCS Tribal Liaison, on implementing the agreement in support of outreach efforts in FY 2015. OTCAC also supports the OCC-NRCS partnership by handling sponsorships for booth displays at many large meetings across OK during the year. OTCAC and OCC appreciate NRCS's commitment to doing outreach to all people in OK.

Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Association (OPBA) -

- OPBA BOD met on May 5 and had a productive gathering and did an assessment of past, present and future of OPBA. Two new BOD members were welcomed onto the BOD and they represent the Pawnee Co. and Canadian Valley LPBAs.
- OPBA is working on changing their IRS status to become an "umbrella" organization with the local prescribed burn associations being "affiliates". The purpose for this is to extend the non-profit status to the local groups and to help provide local boards with additional support.
- OPBA worked with various partners on HB1462 concerning allowing prescribed burns during burn bans. The language was altered and actually makes it more difficult to burn. OPBA leadership worked with sponsors to explain the difficulty the language change creates. The Governor signed it. OPBA will work with various partners next session to provide information on why this makes it more difficult and try to find a solution.
- OPBA, working with the Noble Foundation and The Bramlett Agency, Ardmore, worked out the final details to provide landowners with additional liability coverage, at a reasonable price, for prescribed fire. The brochure has been sent out to offices.
- The OPBA/NRCS FY15 agreement is being implemented. OPBA and OCC appreciate NRCS's assistance with prescribed fire in dealing with the number one natural resource issue in OK.

Oklahoma Invasive Plant Council (OKIPC) -







 - ✓ The watershed structures functioned as planned and designed. Damages to range, cropland, roads, bridges, homes, and businesses would have been much greater had the dams not been in place.
 - ✓ Preliminary information indicates there were 133 auxiliary/emergency spillway flows.
 - ✓ Damage has been reported on 21 of those sites.
 - ✓ For the period of April 18 – May 25 Oklahoma realized 96.33 million dollars in monetary benefits from the 2,107 flood control structures.
 - ✓ For the same period of time 21.42 million dollars in additional monetary benefits would have occurred if the 331 dams planned, but not built were in place.




