MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, November 5, 2018, in the Oklahoma Association of Electric Cooperatives Board Room, 2325 E. I44 Service Road, Oklahoma City, OK 73111 beginning at 7:30 a.m. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 a.m. by Chair Bill Clark. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, November 1, 2018, at the front entrance of the Oklahoma Agriculture Building.

Mr. Lam noted that each year the Commission co-sponsors the annual meeting for conservation districts along with our partner, Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts. Mr. Lam indicated that co-sponsorship entails staff time with planning for the meeting, arranging for speakers and presenters, as well as, attendance at the meeting. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to co-sponsor the 2019 annual meeting of the Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts February 24 – 26, 2019. CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett reported that he thought the Area 1 Regional Meeting went very well. He noted that all counties but one in the area had paid their OACD dues. He also reported that he attended a Fire Ant meeting in Laverne, Oklahoma that was led by Joe Rackley with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture.

Mr. Campbell reported that he attended the 2018 FPAC Leadership Summit in Norman, Oklahoma where he met Secretary Purdue. He also noted that he attended a resource day in Jones, Oklahoma with over one-hundred fifth-graders in attendance.

Mr. Herriman stated that his local board in Nowata County chose not to submit a bid to construct new office space for the NRCS/FSA/District field office. He is hopefully the district will be able to lease the old building to 911 Emergency Services. Mr. Herriman also discussed the legislative race in his area stating that whoever wins the seat it will be a win for agriculture.

Ms. LeGrand reported her local district is currently getting geared up to host their Area Meeting tomorrow, and that she anticipates a good turnout.

Mr. Clark stated he attended a local Natural Resource Day that had over three-hundred third-graders in attendance. He also stated that the Choctaws have agreed to use some of their land for grazing practices demonstrations.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- The Eastern Red Cedar Meeting will be held Thursday, November 8th, 2018.

- There has been over one-million dollars spent on brush management through this year's cost share program.
- Attended Pittsburg Bankers Award Banquet.
- Attended a Poultry Council meeting with Secretary of Agriculture Reese.

Water Quality Program: Mrs. Phillips is in Colorado Springs. Her written report is in the packet.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He noted that GIS has a presentation later today that he and Shellie Willoughby will be delivering. The topic will be covering what the Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services does. They will also cover the capabilities that OK Maps possesses.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Ms. Sawatzky presented the Commissioners with a final report on Cost Share Program Year 18, noting the following items:

- This was the largest Cost Share program year to date, in terms of both participation and funding.
- The Cost Share Program paid out nearly two-million dollars.
- There were 860 different participants and 947 different practices utilized.
- Brush was cleared on over ten-thousand acres and participants were paid one-million eight-hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000.00) to do so.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen noted that monthly activities are outlined in the written report.





PY 18 Cost Share Funds to Participants


