FY 2012 Justice Assistance Grant Awards

The purpose of the 2012 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program is to allow states to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on local needs and conditions.

The primary use of the JAG funds in Oklahoma is to support multijurisdictional drug task forces under the Law Enforcement Purpose Area; however, funds were also utilized to support projects in the Purpose Areas of Prosecution and Courts, Prevention, Corrections and Community Corrections.
