2016 National Criminal History Improvement Project (NCHIP) Grant Award

The purpose of the National Criminal History Improvement Grant is to assist states in meeting various evolving federal and state requirements regarding criminal history and related records.

In 2016, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, Comanche County Detention Center, Delaware County, Weatherford Police Department, and the Wyandotte Nation received six federal awards totaling \$358,780.30.

<i>Grant funds will be used to replace an eleven year old end of life Livescan device in order to report fingerprint and arrest data electronically to OSBI.</i>

<i>Grant funds will be used to upgrade their Livescan, allowing the Delaware County Sheriff's Office to continue to capture and submit fingerprints at the point of arrest and mug shot capture station. The Livescan will also allow fingerprinting for Self Defense Act license, employment, CLEET and licenses.</i>

<i>Grant funds will be used to purchase a Livescan device in order to report fingerprint and arrest data electronically to OSBI. The accuracy of providing instant identification of offenders, offender criminal history as well as wants and warrants of individuals who are being fingerprinted is imperative. In addition to capturing and electronically submitting fingerprint information, the Livescan device also has the capabilities to capture both palm prints and mug shots.</i>		
Wyandotte Nation	Wyandotte	\$13,025.00
<i>Grant funds will be used to upgrade software/hardware to enable electronic fingerprint record submission and returns using an existing Crossmatch Livescan, as well as to install software to enable the electronic submission of records from existing Police Department Records Management System and Court (Municipal, Tribal, District) Records Management Systems.</i>		
Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation	Oklahoma City	\$15,712.00
<i>Grant funds will be used to replace OSBI's archaic Livescan device with an enhanced upgraded version. This new device would allow the OSBI to provide an upgraded fingerprinting service to assist Non-Criminal Justice applicants, Non-Criminal Justice Agencies and local law enforcement ensuring the improved availability and completeness of data related to National Fingerprint based background checks.</i>
