FY 2019 - 2022 Rural Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking Assistance Program

The purpose of the 2017 Rural Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking Assistance Program is to fund specialized investigators and prosecutors that will serve seven (7) rural counties in Oklahoma. The state of Oklahoma received an extension of the 2017 Rural grant to fund two (2) prosecutors and one (1) investigator that specialize in domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking cases for two years.

The two (2) prosecutors will review submitted law enforcement reports, interview victims of these crimes, request follow-up investigation activity, file charges, and prosecute 1,275 cases, in addition to continuing to actively participate in the already established CCR Teams. The investigator will provide 600 follow-up investigative services, including interviewing victims and collateral witnesses, and collecting additional supportive evidence as needed to support the prosecution of these crimes. The investigator will coordinate with local law enforcement and the prosecutor in providing these services as well as other allied professionals in the community.
