## 2017 National Criminal History Improvement Project (NCHIP) Grant Award

The purpose of the National Criminal History Improvement Grant is to assist states in meeting various evolving federal and state requirements regarding criminal history and related records.

In 2017, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, Tulsa Police Department, Woods County, Rogers County, Noble County, McClain County, Major County, and Kiowa County, received eight federal awards totaling \$287,134.00.

## **Criminal History Data and Retention Recovery**

Grant funds will be used to provide correction and entry of Oklahoma County case dispositions for fingerprint-based arrest events found in the state repository for criminal history record information.

## **Livescan Projects**

The project will allow the Tulsa Police Department to have the use of a Livescan to capture and submit fingerprints at the time of arrest and booking.

Woods County Alva \$15,534.00

This project will replace the Livescan purchased by the Woods County Sheriff's Office with a new Livescans which will allow the Woods County Sheriff's Office to continue to capture and submit fingerprints at point of arrest jail bookings.

Award RecipientLocationAmount AwardedRogers CountyClaremore\$19,192.00

The Rogers County Sheriff's department will use awarded funds to purchase Livescan equipment and use it with OSBI's established AFIS that has already established compatibility with FBI Standards.

Noble Nation Perry \$21,929.00

This project will replace the Livescan purchased by the Noble County Sheriff's Office with a new Livescans which will allow the Noble County Sheriff's Office to continue to capture and submit fingerprints at point of arrest jail bookings.

McClain County Purcell \$15,795.00

The Livescan Replacement project will replace the Livescan unit in the county jail to include the scanner, the computer, the printer, a camera, and all software. This will allow us to continue to capture and submit fingerprints at processing in a timely fashion, as well as streamline the process to participate fully in the Interstate Identification Index.

Major County Fairview \$16,428.00

The Sheriff's Office will upgrade current Livescan hardware/software, so that electronic submission to OSBI will be instantaneous. With an integrated system, the turnaround time for the rejections will be much faster, and an additional advantage of upgrading equipment will be quicker and more complete book-ins, which will streamline jailer duties. Further, the addition of a mug shot camera that connects to the new system will allow its transmittal to the OSBI as well, enhancing criminal records at the national level.

Kiowa County Hobart \$15,423.00

The requested funding from this grant will be used for the procurement of livescan equipment and software necessary for the capture and electronic transmission of fingerprints and mugshots to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as other agencies when required.
