The purpose of the Coverdell National Forensic Sciences Improvement Act Grant is to assist states and units of local government in improving the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner/coroner's office services. Among other things, funds may be used to eliminate backlog, train and employ forensic lab personnel, and retain medicolegal death investigators.

In 2017, the State of Oklahoma received \$108,332.00. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, City of Ardmore, Tulsa Police Department, and Oklahoma Office of the Chief Medical Examiner received four (4) federal awards.

The Tulsa Police Department Forensic Laboratory will use grant funds to reduce NIBIN backlog, improve identification of newer drug compounds, and maintain laboratory accreditation.
