2017/18 Sexual Assault Services Program Grant Awards

The purpose of the Sexual Assault Services Program Grant is to provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment, support services, and related assistance for adult, youth, and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims, and those collaterally affected by sexual assault, except for the perpetrator of such victimization. Examples of eligible services may include: crisis intervention, accompaniment to court, individual and group support services, information and referral, and the development and dissemination of materials.

Domestic Violence Intervention Services, Inc. Tulsa \$ 104,930

Grant funds will be used for a counselor to provide sexual assault survivors and their family members with trauma-informed counseling, crisis, and support services.

Help-In-Crisis, Inc. Tahlequah \$ 72,420

Grant funds will be used for a sexual assault advocate to provide services to victim/survivors in Adair and Sequoyah Counties, including rape response utilizing the agency's SANE Program.

Latino Community Development Agency Oklahoma City \$ 58,293

Grant funds will be used for a bilingual advocate who will provide trauma informed services to underserved Hispanic American victims of sexual assault, as well as a therapist who will provide trauma training, assessment, and provide individual, family, and group therapy.

Safenet Services, Inc. Claremore \$ 78,670

Grant funds will be used for a sexual assault advocate dedicated to serving sexual assault victims by providing crisis intervention, safety planning, and accompaniment to court, medical, law enforcement, and social services settings.

Stillwater Domestic Violence Services, Inc. Stillwater \$88,000

Grant funds will be used for a licensed/licensed-eligible mental health professional to provide trauma focused crisis intervention, outreach, advocacy, accompaniment, and individual/group treatment to adults, adolescents, and children who are victims of sexual violence. This professional will also work with the rural underserved population, within a 5-county radius, including the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgendered, Questioning community (GLBTQ), tribal communities, and the aging.
