Sgt. William Rousseau (Retired) was a member of the Tampa Police Dept. in Tampa, Fl. for 29 years. He was the department's Domestic Violence Coordinator and created and supervised the departments Sex Crimes Family Violence Unit. Bill is a nationally recognized expert in domestic violence by the U.S. Department of Justice, U.S. Department of Defense and the U.S. Attorney's Office. He has taught for Florida State University, the University of South Florida, and the United States Army. He has received numerous awards for his work in domestic violence. Bill has a Bachelors degree from the University of South Florida. Bill is the past Chairperson of the Hillsborough County Domestic Violence Fatality Review Team and is the current President of the National Institute of Crime Prevention.

Capt. Rod Reder (Retired) was with the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office in Tampa Fl. for 29 years. He was most recently assigned as a Deputy District Commander. Rod was previously the Crimes Against Persons supervisor, and was the Domestic Violence Coordinator for the Sheriff's Office for seven years. He has taught for Florida State University, the University of South Florida and the U.S. Army. Rod is recognized nationwide as an expert in domestic violence by the U.S. Department of Defense and the U. S. Department of Justice. He has received numerous awards such as the Florida Governor's "Peace at Home Award". Rod is the Vice President of the National Institute of Crime Prevention. Rod is a graduate of the 109th session of the Southern Police Institute, University of Louisville. Rod is Past Board Chairman of the Family Justice Center -Hillsborough County and serves on the Florida Attorney General's statewide Fatality Review Team. Rod has a Bachelor's degree from the University of South Florida in Tampa.

Kathy Haley is a survivor of a nearly fatal domestic violence incident in 1992. She graduated from the University of South Florida in Tampa with a degree in criminal justice in 1985. She was married in 1989 and soon after was hired by the Florida Department of Corrections as a probation officer. In 1992 things dramatically changed after she was shot by her estranged husband. In 1996 she moved to Tallahassee and monitored the batterers' intervention programs. She was appointed to the Governor's Domestic & Sexual Violence Task Force in 1995. Kathy was honored with the JC Penny Golden Rule Award in 1996 and has received several recognitions throughout her career. Kathy returned to Polk County in 2004, where she worked as a probation officer with a domestic violence caseload. Kathy speaks to various groups about the shooting, the aftermath and how she survived everything. After retiring in 2011, she has been a volunteer at the Auburndale Police Department, helping domestic violence victims.
