The Honorable Richard W. Kirby is a native of Elk City, and currently serves as the presiding district judge, seventh judicial district, for the Oklahoma County juvenile division. In addition to his court docket, Judge Kirby also has oversight of the Oklahoma County Juvenile Justice Center, the Court Appointed Special Advocates and the Post-Adjudication Review Board for Oklahoma County. Judge Kirby received his law degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1987, and immediately began work as an assistant district attorney in Beckham County, serving until 1991. At that time, he became an assistant district attorney for Caddo county, serving as lead trial attorney for the office until April 1997, when he joined the staff of Governor Frank Keating, first as Deputy General Counsel, then as Deputy Chief of Staff, ending as Director of Administration and Deputy General Counsel. Before being elected to juvenile court, Judge Kirby served as General Counsel for the Oklahoma Department of Corrections for seven years. Judge Kirby serves on the leadership boards of organizations such as Special Care of Oklahoma City; the Edmond Association of Retarded Citizens; the Putnam City United Methodist Church; and the Oklahoma District Attorney's Justice Assistance Grant Board. He is dedicated to his family, wife Jane and children Christopher and Courtney, and his interests include football, golf and music.

Steven Shillingford is a homicide detective with the Fairfax County Police Department, the largest police department in Northern Virginia. Since December 1997, Detective Shillingford has been a member of the Homicide Unit where he has worked numerous high profile murder cases. His areas of expertise include homicide, sexual assault, and organized crime. Detective Shillingford provides training to law enforcement and civilian groups on violent crime and its impact on victims. He has lectured on criminology and criminal justice, homicide investigation, and sex crimes investigation for the U.S. Department of State, Federal Bureau of Prisons, George Mason University, Lutheran College Washington, Northern Virginia Community College, and a host of local high schools. Detective Shillingford has a bachelor of science degree in criminology and criminal justice from Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti, Michigan, and is well trained and skilled in the area of violent crime and victimology. He was honored as the 2002 Homicide Investigator of the Year by the Virginia Homicide Investigators Association and received the 2005 and 2006 Award for Public Service by the United States Department of Justice (Eastern District of Virginia).

The Honorable Drew Edmondson was elected Attorney General in 1994, and was re-elected in 1998, 2002 and 2006, winning more than 60 percent of the vote in his last two elections. Edmondson served as the 2002 - 2003 President of the National Association of Attorneys General. Under his leadership the attorney general's office has helped reform the death penalty appeals process, established victims' services, and vigorously represented rate payers in telephone, gas and electric rate cases. Before his election as Attorney General, Edmondson was elected, unopposed, to three consecutive terms as Muskogee County District Attorney in 1982, 1986 and 1990. He served as president of the Oklahoma District Attorneys Association and was selected as Outstanding District Attorney for the State of Oklahoma in 1985 and the Outstanding Death Penalty Prosecutor in the 9th and 10th Circuits. Edmondson served one term in the Oklahoma Legislature before entering the University of Tulsa School of Law in 1976. His undergraduate teaching degree is from Northeastern State University, Tahlequah, which he attended after graduating from Muskogee Central High School. Edmondson is a Navy veteran with a tour of duty in Vietnam. He is a member of the Oklahoma Bar Association, the Presbyterian Church and the Democratic Party.

Tamatha Mosier is a Programs Manager for the Oklahoma Office of the Attorney General. For the past twelve years, Ms. Mosier has worked with victims of domestic violence, sexual violence and stalking as well as perpetrators of domestic violence. In addition, Ms. Mosier has served on several boards and committees concerned with domestic violence and sexual assault. These include the Oklahoma Domestic Violence Fatality Review Board, the Child Death Review Board, and the Child Abuse Training Coordination Council. Additionally, she has presented at several conferences. These include the Oklahoma Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Annual Conference, the Oklahoma Domestic and Sexual Violence Annual Conference, and the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services Annual Substance Abuse Conference. Ms. Mosier has also trained in the faith community, teaching clergy and lay parishioners how to recognize and respond to domestic violence; and in the cosmetology profession through the "Cut it Out" program. Currently Ms. Mosier serves on the Interagency Child Abuse Prevention Task Force. In 1995, Tamatha received a Bachelor of Science in Psychology from Southern Nazarene University. She became a Certified Domestic and Sexual Violence Response Professional in 2002. Currently, Ms. Mosier provides administrative and training support for the Victims Services Unit in the Office of Attorney General.


