We hope you will be able to attend this exciting event! We are thankful for our business relationship with you and look forward to serving victims together in the future from our new office location. As you drive into town, be on the look-out for purple or orange pinwheels. Purple is the color representing victims. Orange is the color representing the ONE FIRE Task Force and Victim Services Office. We have labeled these pinwheels, "Pinwheels for Prevention." The pinwheels will be planted around the Cherokee Nation properties, local businesses, and the community as a reminder that there are victims of violent acts in our community, yet the ONE FIRE Task Force and Victims Services Office is here to help those in need.
