About the Speakers - Gary Stansill

Gary Stansill has served as the District Attorney Investigator in District 12 for Rogers County since August, 2011.

Mr. Stansill retired from the Tulsa Police Department in May, 2010 at the rank of sergeant after 35 years of service. During his time with the Tulsa Police Department, he spent twenty three years in sexual assault investigations, nine years supervising the Child Crisis Unit (physical and sexual abuse of children), and eight years supervising the Sex Crime Unit. Mr. Stansill also served in the patrol division, as a jailer and dispatcher, in the fugitive and warrants division, and as a detective.

During his tenure at the Tulsa Police Department, Mr. Stansill investigated and supervised numerous high profile cases including most of the serial rape cases dating back to 1987, along with the Oklahoma's first Amber Alert, which resulted in a successful recovery. As a supervisor for the Child Crisis Unit he successfully merged the Unit with the Child Abuse Network which became a national model for the multi-disciplinary approach to child abuse investigations. He has trained for the Tulsa Police Department in areas of sexual assault, interview/interrogations, court room testimony and major case investigations. The Tulsa Police Department has recognized Mr. Stansill their expert on interviews and interrogations.

Well versed in many areas of law enforcement through both education and training, Gary Stansill is recognized statewide in Oklahoma as an expert in sexual assault investigations. He has worked with Oklahoma legislators in amending several sexual assault statutes. He consulted with the Oklahoma Office of the Attorney General in creating a curriculum in Evidence Based Sexual Assault training, which has been mandated for all law enforcement in Oklahoma. He currently serves as a consultant and sexual assault instructor for Oklahoma Regional Community Policing Institute and has in the past four years instructed Evidence Based Sexual Assault to over 2,000 Oklahoma certified law enforcement officials.

Mr. Stansill has achieved his Oklahoma Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) Advanced Law Enforcement Certificate and is an Advanced Instructor for CLEET. In addition to the Evidence Based Sexual Assault training, Mr. Stansill has presented topics on sexual assault and child abuse investigations during several local, regional and statewide training conferences.

About the Speakers - Irene Asai

Irene Asai has served as an Assistant District Attorney in Garfield County since September, 2008. She is currently the supervising attorney in the Garfield County District Attorney's Office. From May, 2003 to August, 2008, Ms. Asai served as Assistant District Attorney in Tulsa County where she supervised the Domestic Violence Unit.

Ms. Asai began her legal career as a deputy prosecuting attorney in Pasco, Franklin County, Washington in 1977. In 1980, she went into private practice in southeastern Washington (the area known as the Tri-Cities) where she had a civil and criminal defense practice. In 1986, Ms. Asai left what she refers to as the "dark side" and returned to prosecution as a deputy prosecuting attorney in Port Orchard, Kitsap County, Washington. Initially, Ms. Asai was assigned as the special assault (sex crimes involving both children and assault) deputy prosecuting attorney. Later, she became the Assistant Chief of Criminal Prosecuting Attorney and the supervisor of the misdemeanor and juvenile units. In 1994, Ms. Asai left Port Orchard to become the Chief of Criminal Prosecuting Attorney in Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington. Ms. Asai also served in the Adams County Prosecuting Attorney's Office and the Wahkiakum County Prosecuting Attorney's Office.

During Ms. Asai's career as a prosecutor she has tried virtually every type of criminal case from a speeding infraction to a capital murder case in which the death penalty was sought. Ms. Asai often serves as a speaker for various local and state conferences, training law enforcement, advocates and prosecutors on domestic violence, sexual assault and other criminal justice topics. Ms. Asai is a certified Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) trainer on domestic violence. She was named the Prosecutor of the Year in the 2009 Awards for Excellence in Action Against Domestic Violence.

About the Speakers - Karla Docter

Karla Docter serves as the Senior Director of Sexual Assault Services for the YWCA of Oklahoma City where she is also a Victim Advocate. Karla supervises the SANE and Hospital Sexual Assault Advocacy Programs as well as the Prevention Education Program for Oklahoma County.

Karla graduated from the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee in 2005 with a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, a Minor in Psychology, and a Certificate in Forensic Science. Karla is a Certified Domestic and Sexual Violence Response Professional through the Oklahoma Coalition against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault and a graduate of the Oklahoma Victim Assistance Academy.

Karla has been an Advocate for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking for over six years. She serves on the Oklahoma County SANE Steering Committee, Sexual Assault Response Team, Sex Offender Management Team and the Oklahoma Human Trafficking Task Force.
