RE: Voter Registration Information

You are eligible to register to vote if you are a United States citizen, a resident of Oklahoma and at least 18 years of age. However, as a person who has been convicted of a felony, you may not register to vote or renew your voter registration until after the period of time it takes for your original judgment and sentence to expire. This means that although you may have been released from custody, you still must wait until your sentence expires before you can register to vote.

To register to vote you must fill out a voter registration application form. Voter applications are available at your county election board, post offices, tag agencies, libraries and many other public locations. You will be offered a voter registration application when you get your driver's license and when you apply for assistance at some government agencies.

You may also download an application form from [www.ok.gov/-elections/](http://www.ok.gov/-elections/) or send a request to receive a form by U.S. mail. The application form asks for: your name and address; your political affiliation; your birth date; your driver's license number; and the last four digits of your Social Security number (required if no driver's license). You must sign and date the oath printed on the form. When you sign the voter registration application form, you swear that you are eligible to vote.
