Annual Report

Oklahoma's Community Service Sentencing Program was enacted in 1988, re-created in 1999, and is codified at Title 22, Section 991a-4.1 of the Statutes of the State of Oklahoma. The specified purpose of the program is "to provide an alternative to incarceration for nonviolent felony offenders who would normally be sentenced to incarceration in a state institution."

The Community Service Sentencing Program accomplishes the statutory purpose through two means:

I. Contracts with counties for local community service sentencing programs.

Title 22, Section 991a.G.1 authorizes the Department of Corrections to contract with counties for local community services sentencing programs. During fiscal year 1998 a total of 56 counties contracted for these local programs. The activities of these counties are reported in the section of this report titled "Community Services Sentencing Program."


Most of the county contract funds have been utilized to establish and maintain local community service work programs. The work programs allow offenders to repay their debt to society through labor for the benefit of the community. Contract monies are used for personnel to establish and monitor local projects and for materials and equipment necessary to operate the program.

Each contracting county is offered an opportunity to submit a narrative and photograph for this report. Their contributions appear alphabetically in this document after the statewide report. A careful reading of this section reveals that the communities are well served by the programs. State funding allowed projects to be completed which were not possible without the labor provided. Offenders sentenced to the programs not only repay their debt, but they often point with pride to their accomplishments.


II. Alternative Confinement in the County Jail

Under Title 22, Section 991a 4.1, the judge may order the offender to confinement in the county jail in lieu of imprisonment in a state facility for nights or weekends for up to a year. In such cases, the Department of Corrections reimburses the county sheriff for the incarceration costs, not to exceed \$20 per day. During fiscal year 2000, 53 counties participated under this provision of the statute.


GROWTH OF COMMUNITY SERVICE SENTENCING PROGRAM Hours Performed by Offenders




COMMUNITY SERVICE SENTENCING PROGRAM

FY 1999 versus FY 2000





FY 1999 versus FY 2000




COMMUNITY SERVICE SENTENCING PROGRAM

FY 1999 versus FY 2000




COMMUNITY SERVICE SENTENCING PROGRAM

FY 1999 versus FY 2000




INCREASE IN ALTERNATIVE CONFINEMENT


Number of Days Reimbursed to Counties






Community Service Sentencing Program Hours Assigned and Hours Completed


