

Oklahoma Department of Corrections Leadership Academy

If you are interested in getting an **“INSIDER’S VIEW”** of the Oklahoma Department of Corrections (DOC) and how it operates, without being convicted, then you might be interested in Leadership Academy. Leadership Academy is the first and only program of its kind designed for corrections that is open to the public and allows participants access to a “behind the walls” look at prisons and corrections first hand.

Who can attend:

Open to all business, community, educational, and faith based representatives.

What are the requirements:

- Minimum age of 18 years
- Oklahoma resident
- Candidates are encouraged to attend all classes



There is no cost to participate. Classes are held on Tuesday’s and meet at the Oklahoma Department of Corrections Administration Building located at 3400 Martin Luther King Avenue, Oklahoma City, then depart to various field visits throughout the state.

Field Visits

- **Oklahoma State Penitentiary**, the state’s only and oldest maximum security prison for men
- **Mabel Bassett Correctional Center**, the state’s largest female medium security prison and reception center
- **Lexington Assessment and Reception Center**, an all male medium security prison
- **James Crabtree Correctional Center**, an all male medium security prison

- **Joseph Harp Correctional Center**, an all male medium security prison, Oklahoma Correctional Industries, furniture factory, Geriatric Offender unit and the state’s largest Mental Health unit
- **Kate Barnard Community Corrections Center**, the state’s largest female community security center
- **Jackie Brannon Correctional Center**, one of the state’s oldest all male minimum security prisons, originally operated as a trusty unit of the Oklahoma State Penitentiary.

The Leadership Academy is a 6-week session of classes implemented to enhance the understanding of the Oklahoma Department of Corrections, its operations and its impact on the community.
